

It's been an historic summer for the LCS community! After the decision by the membership to purchase the former Central Public School, our "Forward in Faith" capital campaign launched mid-June. Campaign team members and canvassers got right to work visiting donors and carried on through the summer months. On August 4th we were



able to announce that we had reached our minimum go-ahead goal of 85% of funds raised. As of this printing we have raised 96% of our total goal of \$2.7 million and continue to work towards reaching 100%. This campaign was done in a short time, over the normally quiet summer months, and right after a supporting church's building campaign. Despite all those challenges it has been a success. We are so thankful for God's blessing on our work and all the glory is His. We are thankful to the entire Board for their commitment through additional meetings and big decisions throughout this process.

The Board is back on a more regular schedule and moving ahead this fall with final preparatory steps for closing the purchase of Central. We look forward to this year of working with the Building Committee as well as enjoying the last year in our current building.

Another item of thankfulness is for the upcoming completion of the constitution review. We thank Garth Bierma, John Greydanus and Ralph Bakker for their commitment to seeing this document be updated and for their wisdom in the proposed changes. This has been on the Strategic Plan for some time and now we are able to complete the task. We are ever mindful that we stand on the shoulders of those who have served before us and we are grateful for this dedicated school community. We appreciate your prayers and support as we continue to move "forward in faith".

Introducing the KIMS




When asked what brought them to LCS this was their answer:
