NOTE: This was written and intended for last week's Weekly Messenger – before the three snow days. However, I thought it was still relevant for you to hear what our staff accomplished on the January 25th PD day.

Friday could have been a snow day. However, just because the students were at home, the teachers showed up to work and we had a very good day of learning and accomplishing tasks.

In the first part of the morning we discussed a few chapters out of a book we are reading together called, "Becoming the Teacher You Wish You'd Had". One chapter was all about how to improve as a classroom teacher and a significant factor was the professional interactions among staff members. There is a lot of collective wisdom among teachers themselves and sharing it with each other is incredibly valuable. We are blessed with a staff that gets along, feels comfortable with each other, shares strategies, and asks for help. This is a great step in becoming better teachers.

We also spent some time discussing how effectively Responsive Classroom strategies are being used in several of our classrooms. As a result, we set goals for how these strategies could be used within the larger school body and school environment – not just the classrooms. Hopefully these strategies will enable LCS to be a safe place and a good place for all students.

Our last discussion time was spent with the primary teachers discussing and planning their new integrated approach to literacy. The Junior and Intermediate teachers discussed the latest MAP results and how some results were communicated at Parent Teacher conferences and how other results could be used to affect our teaching.

The last part of the day was a more physical one. We set out to clean up several rooms that we never had time in the summer or September, to properly organize so they could be used effectively. We cleaned up the art room, the staff room and the stage. That felt good.

We had a good day! Maybe another day we will have our snow day.
