worth the effort."


security and G o d 's blessing. I want this picture - to be loved, to feel safe in my home and community. I doubt that I'm alone in

TO BE KNOWN, TO BE LOVED

It will soon be time for teachers to fill out report cards again. From my perspective, most of the report is relatively easy to fill out. The subject area boxes are completed from information teachers have collected over the term, organized and structured in a way to determine a good evaluation for each child. When that is all done, there is a larger box that looms with great anticipation. No direction, no limit, free reign to write in the comment section.

As parents, we all look forward to reading what has been written in this box. My direction to staff for this area is to articulate that each child is known, they belong, and they are loved. Isn't that the basic desire for ourselves and for our children? We were created as unique individuals to live in community, and to love one another.

Students want to be known and parents want teachers to know their child. The fun part is that there are no doubles but that each child has been created uniquely. The question is whether we have recognized their uniqueness and encouraged that child to develop those gifts. God does the same for us. Several times in

the Bible (Matthew 10:30 and Luke 12:7), God assures us that he knows us and cares for us so intimately that every hair on our head is numbered. That is knowing us and it feels good. I can't say that I know my students that well. It is good to be known.

Every child also wants to be loved. A child needs to know that they have a place in our classroom, in our school, where they are not only safe, but that they are loved and cared for. I often hear our teachers talk about their students as if they were their own children. When they refer to "their kids", I have to listen closely to hear if they are talking about their own biological child(ren) or their students, because they speak of them with the same love. That is special. It is also an important characteristic for each student to feel free to learn. We hope each student feels the love of their teachers every day.

Every student wants to, and deserves to, be known and loved. It is our prayer that as we teach, we are being used by God to show our students (our children) that they are loved by us and that they are loved by God. What a wonderful feeling.


