Music - Mrs. Wright

The students in **JK and SK** have been enjoying the unit on trains and tempo (the speed of the music).

Students in **grades 1-8 are** doing Drum Fit on Mondays in April. Students enjoy getting some good exercise while learning some fun rhythms and note values.

Drum Fit Club (grades 4-8) meets Mondays at lunch in April. We are preparing a routine to the song "Old Church Choir" by Zach Williams for the Celebration of Learning and Grandparents' and Grandfriends' Day.

Choir continues to meet Tuesdays at lunch. We plan to go to Livingston Manor on Tuesday, May 7th at 1:30pm. We will be walking from the school. We are also preparing some pieces for the Celebration of Learning and Grandparents' and Grandfriends' Day.

Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda

Spring has sprung in JK! We made some beautiful flower art last week to add some colour to our classroom. We also planted bean and flower seeds and will check on them this week to see if they have started to sprout. I know the students are looking forward to that. This week we will be reading some stories about caterpillars and butterflies.

Our **focus letter** this week is W, and children are welcome to bring in a show and tell that begins with W. In our *Handwriting Without Tears* workbooks, we have learned how to print all our uppercase letters! We will be reviewing our uppercase letters before we start to look at matching upper and lowercase letters using our names. In **math**, we are going to learn about estimation by attempting to estimate 5 and 10.

In **Bible**, we have concluded our *Parables* unit and will start our *Easter* unit beginning with *Palm Sunday* and *The Lord's Supper*. We have a new memory verse, John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life."

In health, we continue to learn about our five senses, focusing on our sense of hearing.

Senior Kindergarten – Mrs. Heida

This week we will **focus on the letter** Rr, please send in a show and tell that begins with that letter. We will continue to work on listening for ending sounds and the number of syllables in a word. Our new sight word is "for", we will be creating a sight word book using this word as part of Morning Workshop.

In math, we are focusing on shapes such as triangles and squares, as well as working with numbers.

In **Bible**, we are learning about the Garden of Gethsemane and Jesus before the high priest. We will be learning John 3:16 as memory work. This will be completed in class.

Grade 5 and 6 - Ms. Van Kampen

French: This week's focus: vocabulary for spring, situational dialogues, and definite (le, la, les) and indefinite (un, une, des) articles. Last Thursday's test on avoir & être has been (marked and) returned to students.

Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Katerberg

Bible: Our current Bible unit is 1 Peter. We will complete this unit this week with a test on Friday.

Math: We will be continuing our work to get our transformations straight. After some reflection, it seems that the class is really enjoying lines of symmetry although the grade 6 class did have trouble with rotational symmetry. Today we will cover our final topic, tiling or tessellation. We will have a practice test on Wednesday and a test on Thursday or Friday.

Spelling: This week is lesson 27. Work is due on Tuesday, quiz on Friday.

Social Studies: We will start a new unit on Canada and its trading partners.

Health: Our next few weeks will focus on nutrition.

Literature: We are studying *Anne of Green Gables*. Students are expected to complete journal questions and entries Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. This week we plan to read chapters 16 - 21.

We were challenged by the host school, Providence Christian School, to help support EduDeo in building 8 wells in Zambia close to schools, so that children would not have to choose between clean drinking water and going to school.
