#### **GRADUATION AND KINGDOM CITIZENSHIP**

In September, we began the year focused on Matthew 6:33, "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness; and all these things will be given to you as well". Throughout the year we tried to instill in our students a recognition that they are citizens of two kingdoms: an earthly one based on where they live and a heavenly one based on their faith in God. Augustine once said that he can tell which city you are truly committed to by the way you live your life. Our verse states that if we place our investments into our citizenship in God's kingdom, the details around our citizenship in our earthly kingdom will all fall into place.

June brings about graduations. Graduations are a testament to our investment in educating children. As our students graduate, whether from SK or Grade 8, we hope they have learned a few things. Maybe they learned to identify letters, count to one hundred, read a simple sentence or write a coherent essay, solve complicated equations, or play

a musical instrument. School is about learning and we hope we accomplished some goals in this area.

> However, we also know that we are here to nurture each child to be citizens in God's

kingdom. As each student enters our school doors on a daily basis, we have the opportunity to help them see the beauty of belonging to God's kingdom, understand their role in it, and develop a commitment to belonging to it. Just as seeds need to be planted, watered, and cared for, so a child's faith needs to be developed in much the same way. When we observe the graduations in June, we hope to see evidence that each graduate, whether SK or Grade 8, has developed in their citizenship in God's kingdom.

At the SK graduation, we will be singing songs such as "Jesus Loves Me" and "Jesus Loves the Little Children". These songs speak of Jesus caring about us. We will also sing "I've Got the Joy, Joy, Joy" which is our response and a statement about what it is like to be a part of God's kingdom. At the Grade 8 graduation, we will sing songs like "Who You Say I Am" where we, along with the graduates, will profess that we are children of God and there is a place in his house for us. I pray that those words will be sung by each graduate, understanding that being a child of God identifies their true citizenship.

I pray that these upcoming graduations will be celebrations of academic progress and accomplishments, but also professions of faith and celebrations of kingdom citizenship.


