PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

As our theme this year we are going to focus on the fruits of the Spirit. These attributes of God are listed in Galatians 5:22-23a, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control".

I am always challenged by the counter-cultural message of the gospel. It seems to go against everything our current society would have us do. Jesus, who was supposed to come as a triumphant king, went to the sinners. Jesus, who was expected to be among the important people of the day, went to minister to the perceived lowly people of the day – tax collectors and prostitutes. Jesus modeled the fruits of the Spirit in his life on earth.

Now, today, in a me first, have to get ahead, have to climb the ladder, and survival of the fittest society, Jesus calls us to be kind, gentle, and patient, to value peace and offer forgiveness, to exhibit self-control and show goodness. Jesus calls us to consider others better than ourselves and to serve others rather than seek out our own needs.

Our task this year is to teach our students that God values these Spirit attributes even though a large part of our society may not. We will focus on each characteristic to highlight how it might look in our lives and in our school. I think it would be great if our students, teachers and school community would be known for our gentleness, goodness, kindness, love, joy, peace, patience, faithfulness and self-control. What if we all portrayed the fruits of the Spirit and everyone could see that we reflect God through the way we live.

From the Library: Welcome back to the library, we hope that the students will again enjoy the great space we have been blessed with. We are excited about some new books we purchased over the summer, thank you especially to our Grandparents and Grandfriends.

Library days are again Tuesday (Grades JK, SK, & 3/4) and Wednesday (Grades 1, 2/3, 5/6. 7/8). As a reminder of the library policy, we do not charge late fines for books, however if a book has not been returned for 60 days you are responsible for the replacement cost of the book. FROM THE CLASSROOMS

Music - Mrs. Wright

First of all, I wanted to say thank you to all of those who supported our fundraiser to purchase ukuleles for our music program! We are hoping to have those ordered in soon to begin in October with the grades 7 and 8 class. You may still contribute towards these instruments. Thank you!

We have had a good time in our first few music classes. We have learned and reviewed expectations for music and have done some activities to get us moving and to get to know each other better. Most classes have written their own or shared together their goals, hopes and dreams for music.

JK and SK: We have been learning about singing versus speaking voices with help from our friend Melody the elephant.

Grades 1-4: We have been enjoying a Russian folk dance "Sasha." Students have also been learning about beat and rhythm and have been learning to sing the solfa for our song "I Like You."

Grades 5 and 6: We have been learning about the elements of music and we used our listening ears to notice the sounds around us on a sound walk.

Grades 7 and 8: We have been reviewing and learning the music alphabet and how to name notes in the treble and bass clefs. We also enjoyed a sound walk where we took note of the sounds around us.

Curriculum:

Spelling - Our words this week are: **I**, **a**, **to**, **it**, **at** -we will have a test on Friday.

French - We have jumped right in to learning a new language. Ask your child how to say hello in French! *All About Me* books will be sent home this week.

Memory Work: Psalm 119:11 "I have hidden your work in my heart that I might not sin against you."

Grade 2 and 3 - Mrs. Claus

A new week is upon us. We are continuing to grow as a class and community. The students are becoming more familiar with the classroom and with the expectations.

Scholastic flyers are going home this week. They are due Wednesday, September 25. Orders can be made online or sent to school. Purchases help our class library grow and help provide needed tools in the classroom.

Library is on Wednesday. Please return both books so you can take 2 new books out.

Spelling test is on Friday:

Gr 2: as, has, fox, box, mix, egg, jam, pet, nap, big

Gr 3: next, left, help, please, believe, many, very, been, seen, she, between, three, easy, sea, leave

Math: Grade 2 will have a test on Wednesday on patterning.

Memory Work: On Friday we will say our memory work: Ephesians 4:29.

Grade 3 and 4 - Mrs. Delleman

Math - We are finishing Unit 1 on patterns and will have our quiz on THURSDAY. For the quiz, students will need to know how to identify pattern rules and how to finish number patterns. They will also need to know how to round

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numbers to the tens and hundreds. Grade 3s will need to know various ways to represent numbers (words, base ten blocks), and Grade 4s will need to know addition and subtraction patterns. Memory Work - We are starting to memorize the Old Testament books for our memory work. This week, students will need to know the Books of the Law (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy) in order for FRIDAY. **Spelling** - We are starting Unit 2 words this week and will have dictation on FRIDAY. The Spelling lists (for the whole year) are on the Spelling City website. This website was shown to students last week. If you go to spellingcity.com and search "Mrs. Delleman" my name will come up and when you click on my name, a list of all the units will open up. When you click on the list name, the words appear as well as a button called "Games" where students can play a number of activities with their spelling words.

Cursive - Last week we did letters "o" and "c". The cursive pages for these letters are due on FRIDAY. GRADE 3 pages are 6, 12, 27 (JUST letters "o" and "c") and GRADE 4 pages are 8 and 38 (just the bottom two lines with lowercase "o" and "c").

Art - We will be doing leaf art this week!! Students will need to bring in 5 leaves for WEDNESDAY.

Grade 5 and 6 - Mrs. Vogel

French: We are continuing to work through a little more review so we can have a solid start to our year.

Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Katerberg

Bible: Our Bible unit is *The Setting of God's Story*. Memory work is books of the Bible and this is due on Friday. **Word Work:** Lesson 2 guiz on Friday.

Science: Students have been given an assignment that asks them to go stargazing with a parent on a clear evening. Please take some time this week to complete this assignment. We have had a lot of overcast days, but this week does look more promising for clear evening skies.

Math: Today we will complete our first unit with a unit test. Our next unit is going to be an intensive number sense unit. Students may have daily math homework. As a rule, no more than 30 minutes should be required to complete this.

Writing: The personal narrative is due on Friday. Students will have some time to work on this in class but slower writers and typers will need to complete this at home. There is a spot for this assignment on Google classroom.

Grade 7 and 8 - Ms. tenBrink

Bible - Handouts, pgs 7,8,9, were due today. Again, all handouts from Monday and Wednesday are due this Friday. Remember to hand them in before class begins. This week Wednesday is our first memory work, Deuteronomy 6:4-6. Be ready to say or write it. Our next memory work will be Jeremiah 31:33-34 and is due on October 2.

Grade 7 and 8 - Mrs. Vogel

French - We are continuing to work through a little more review so we can have a solid start to our year. Quiz - etre and avoir verbs in present tense Thursday, Sept. 19.

Geography - We are learning about the landforms around the world and how they are formed. Both the Canada map and the Map of the World will be handed back this week. We will have a guiz tomorrow, Sept. 17.

Guided Reading and Writing - We are working on a combined unit at the moment on short stories.
