In **Bible**, we will read about the Angel's visit and the birth of Jesus.

We will continue to practice our songs and memory verse for the Christmas program on December 17.

Senior Kindergarten – Mrs. Heida

This week we will **focus** on the **letter J**. On Thursday bring in something <u>Christmas</u> for **show and tell**. This week we will continue to print uppercase letters that begin at the middle top of our Handwriting Without Tears

gray squares.
