PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

When I turn the news on the television, a significant amount of time is dedicated to the Covid-19 virus. Initially it felt like it was a distant issue for us in rural Ontario, but more and more cautions are being provided for everyone. Friday, I received emails with information from Christian Schools International, Edvance Christian Schools, and the North Perth Health Unit. There is a heightened awareness for schools.

As a summary, the message is that we should not panic. Be aware and practice good hygiene. Here are some good ideas shared in those emails.

- ➤ As of March 5, 2020, the risk in Ontario for the human-to-human spread of COVID-19 is still considered low.
- > The confirmed cases in Ontario are all associated with travel to affected areas.
- Although the infection can be life-threatening, most people who have been infected with COVID-19 have not been severely ill.

What schools should do

- Students/children and staff who are ill with fever and/or infectious respiratory symptoms should stay home from school
- o Avoid touching the eyes, nose or mouth
- Practice good respiratory etiquette cough or sneeze into a tissue or flexed elbow and dispose of used tissues
- Practice hand hygiene wash hands with plain soap and water; use alcohol-based hand sanitizers where handwashing sinks are not available
- Keep all sinks in washrooms, kitchens and classrooms well-stocked with handwashing supplies
- o Surgical masks are NOT recommended

Travel recommendations

March break is coming up. If students and their families are planning to travel or returning from travel, the current recommendations are:

- Check the <u>Public Health Agency of Canada Travel Health Notices</u> webpage before you go for the latest advisories
- Be aware that the situation may change while you are away and you may get stranded where you are, or you may be required to self-isolate at home upon your return
- o It is always good practice to monitor your health after you return from travelling. If you become sick, inform your healthcare provider of your travel history.
- o Take regular infection control measures while you are travelling to prevent getting sick.

We continue to pray for those effected by the virus, those in virus affected areas, those currently in isolation, and for those researching cures and protective strategies.
