PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

I checked my last Weekly Messenger (March 9) and it was also about Covid-19. The message on March 9 was that the risk in Ontario was considered low, we should not panic, practice good hygiene, monitor our international travel and be aware that, when we returned, we may have to self isolate. One month later, Ontario is in a state of emergency and we all get an emergency text message that Covid-19 can be deadly and we are to stay home unless we are an essential worker, picking up groceries or prescriptions, or going to a medical appointment. Life has changed!

Education has also changed in the last month. We went from traditional school to March break, to remote learning. For staff and students, we forfeit being together every weekday to seeing each other through computer screens. New schedules and routines are being established. Dining rooms and basements are turned into workspaces, for parents and students alike. This new model provides us opportunity to evaluate traditional school through the lens of remote learning.

Our staff is working through the steep learning curve of remote teaching. We are wrestling with what can be accomplished with students at home, how much work is enough or too much, and how do we accomplish the value of interactive, dynamic education through distance learning. We had a good start to this process, and we hope that we will continue to adapt to provide quality learning opportunities for your children.

We still meet remotely with our staff every Monday morning. Through these times we pray together. We also support each other as teachers learning a new craft. We share our new daily schedules and activities, our successes and frustrations in remote teaching, and we wonder how to work together as a team to serve our students and their families. I value these two hours and it sets a good start to my week.

Some of the things you can expect:

- We continue to create learning opportunities for all students knowing that these opportunities are different for JK students than for Grade 8 students. Classroom teachers are responsible for providing learning activities that engage their students and encourage growth. If you have specific questions regarding student learning, please contact their teacher directly.
- We will continue to discuss this new educational model. Whether it involves emailed assignments, recommended websites, Google Classroom communication, teleconference gatherings, or interactive teleconference teaching we are learning on the go. As a result, our style and expectations may be changing too.
- We will continue to communicate with you through the Weekly Messenger. Although classroom teachers have already created direct communication with many of you, the Weekly Messenger will continue to be a tool for you and our broader community.
- We continue to serve you as families and students. You will all be called by Rita Ann to discuss your current situation and learning from home. Please provide her with your perspective of our new reality. If you have any specific questions, concerns or joys, you can also contact me directly. I also want to mention a warning and caution. In order to facilitate remote learning, access to video communication is provided through most of our student LCS Google accounts. We ask that you, as parents, please discuss appropriate use of online video access. I suggest that you monitor each device that has video capabilities and ensure it remains in a public setting in your house. We are all thrown into this new reality without instructions, training, direction, and cautions. Please discuss this with your child(ren).

These are scary times. We hibernate and isolate. We listen to the news, we are fearful, and we contemplate our own mortality. In contrast, this week we also prepare for Easter and consider the suffering Jesus went through on our behalf, suffering that turns our physical mortality into spiritual eternity. This week I challenge you to balance your personal fears with your trust in God, your self isolation with your partnership with Christ, and your relationships in your house with your relationships in Christian community. Easter gives us Hope! I pray that you will experience that hope in your life today.

Hello JK families! I am so missing seeing all of your precious little ones. I have sent several emails over the past two weeks, if you have not received these please let me know. I know that I have had a couple of incorrect email addresses and I apologize for that. Moving forward I hope we can have good contact with each other. As we will be away from our school building for a while longer, I am hoping to send you a packet of printed printing pages that your child can work through. These include the remaining letters from our workbook as well as numbers 1-10. There are also some pages to practice printing their names.

Each week via email, I will "assign" a couple of pages and, if possible, request that you send me a picture of the completed page. I will also send the next phonics song video. I hope to include a "challenge" each week to help practice some core concepts like colours, shapes, patterns, number and letter/sound recognition and rhyming. Show and tell this week will be something that is red and something that is new. Please send in your pictures. In **math**, we will continue to work with teen numbers, using a ten frame to help with place value.

In **Bible**, we will hear the story of Jesus Dying on the Cross. Our **memory work** is John 3:16.

For **science**, find some signs of spring....do you see flowers blooming like crocuses and daffodils? Do you hear the birds sing? Have you seen a robin? What are some signs of spring?

Bible – We have been working through weekly assignments for Bible posted on Google classroom. The lessons consist of a lesson on slides and a response that can be printed and completed or done online. Each week the assignment is posted by 8:30 Monday morning and is due Friday at 3:00pm.

This week we are doing more reading and answering questions. Students were reminded to give full effort in their work. It needs to be done well, i.e. proper sentence structure, proper spelling, and capitalization. Read through everything carefully before you turn in.

Lastly, this week's lesson is on when God says no, with a focus on the story of David and Bathsheba's son. The due date is usually Friday at 3:00pm but since it is Good Friday this week, the assignment is due on Thursday at 3:00pm.

Hello grade 7/8 families! The encouragement and support received from you all as we made this transition online has been amazing. Thank you for supporting our school so well as we do the best we can. Writing - We are going to start up again with our poetry unit.

Typing - I will unlock around 10 levels every week for the students to be able to work on. They should be aiming for 3 stars minimum on every typing level, 1 star minimum on every game level (the games tend to be challenging to accomplish more stars). If they have accomplished the 3 stars on 3-5 levels that week and they need more to do they can try to get all 5 stars on all levels.

Geography - We started a group project but no fear! All the students need to do is finish the 2 sections of the chart associated with their topic. I will plan group meetings with them once all that work has been completed. **Phys. Ed.** - Get outside, play, go for a walk/run/jog. Enjoy the beautiful creation God has placed all around us.
