PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

We are three weeks into school and have learned a lot. Aside from the curriculum, we learned how all the theory and speculation in August regarding restrictions around the school opening have played out. We changed from all the "What ifs?" to "What now?". At least now we know what we are working with.

Overall, it has been a good start. I applaud each parent for your diligence in daily screening and your attention to your child's health. Please continue to inform the school office through a phone call or email so that we can track attendance and reasons for absenteeism. I thank you for your commitment to doing your part to keep LCS a healthy place. The students adapted and are wearing their masks in the school and on the bus. Teachers are wearing masks in the school and most of the time while teaching. The staggered recess times are working, and the staggered washrooms times nicely spread out the use of the facilities. We continue with hand sanitizing and hand washing as part of our day. Although that may seem like a lot, if you observe the regular school day, it looks normal.

With the increase in the number of cases in the province and fear of tighter restrictions, we will be making a few changes in the school as well. As a staff we decided that an even higher commitment by all staff to social distance and wearing masks more often is required. We have been good around students, but we need to maintain our commitment when around only staff as well. We are committed to making the school a safe place to work for each employee.

The most significant change we will be making is the restriction to parents and visitors. We started by trying to use the lobby as a gathering place, but it hasn't worked great. So now we will lock the front door and communicate with visitors in the smaller lobby (between the two double doors). Also, for after school pick up, we will be bringing the children outside when we know you are waiting outside or in the parking lot. Again, we are navigating this pandemic in faith but also in the responsibility God has given us to be good neighbours to each other and care for one another. Following recommendations around safety during this time seems a good idea.

FROM THE CLASSROOMS

Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda

This week we will continue our farm theme by painting with straw, doing a horse colour matching activity, and reading some farm stories.

We will be talking about what rules are and deciding what would be good rules for our classroom.

In **language**, we will be using our listening skills to hear different sounds.

In **math**, we will be continuing to look at sorting by sorting people! We will also be looking at opposites.

In **Bible**, we continue with our creation unit and learn about day 6 and day 7 when God created animals, people and then rested.

In **health**, we will learn how in many ways all people are alike, but each person is unique in many ways as well. Listening is an important skill so that you can learn to hear instructions and know what is happening in our classroom environment. Also, very important to listen in order to hear letter sounds which is a phonetics skill. We will also be focusing on rhyming words.

In **math**, we are sorting and learning counting strategies.

In **Bible**, we are wrapping up the Creation Unit.

Creation Studies- The adventure with maps continues this week. We will be doing some review and talking about who is our neighbour.

Grade 2 – Mrs. Dykstra

Hello parents! We celebrated this week as each student successfully recited our memory words from James 1:19! We also achieved 20 minutes of reading stamina - woohoo (a small surprise in a white paper bag is coming home today).

BIBLE: new memory words Psalm 105:1:2 "Give thanks to the LORD, call on his name; make known among the nations what he has done. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts." We will have an oral assessment on Wednesday, October 7. After spending last week talking about prayer, Bible lessons have us digging into an Old Testament review and seeing God's ever-present faithfulness.

MATH: "Doubles, doubles, we can add doubles!" Doubles, doubles plus 1, odd and even numbers are being practiced this week. We will have a tiny quiz in math this week so ask Mrs. Dykstra if further instruction for September learning is needed.

SIGHT WORDS (recognize 3 seconds or less): *always cold goes these wish write* **READING WORKSHOP**: A new unit! Readers Build Good Habits (check Seesaw for details).

WRITING WORKSHOP: Mentor texts give us lots of ways to see ourselves as writers. We read one every day this week and launch our journals from these engaging picture books.

SPELLING: to be tested Friday, October 2: as, has, fox, box, mix, egg, jam, pet, nap, big Bonus words: always, cold, goes, write. We do practice in a variety of ways in class. Spelling City is an online option for home study, if needed. (search for Mrs. Dykstra at https://www.spellingcity.com)

CREATION STUDIES: demonstration experiments this week (duplicate at home if desired)

Review of: solid, liquid, gas, absorption, transparent, opaque, translucent. Learn: buoyancy

Grade 3 - Mrs. Claus

Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Katerberg

In **Bible**, we are working on a new unit, "The Last Days of Judah." Memory work this week Friday is Jeremiah 17:7-10

In **math**, we have started a new unit entitled "Whole Numbers". We will do lots of adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing in the next while.
