Principal's Corner

Over the last few weeks, students in Grades 3 – 8 have been doing MAP tests (Measure of Academic Progress). We began using these standardized tests a few years ago. The interesting aspect to these tests is that they adapt to each student. If the student is consistently getting questions correct, they are prompted with more difficult questions. If they are getting them incorrect, they adapt to different questions. Eventually the test will find a balance that represents the student's current level of learning and progress. As a result, each student's test is unique. We offer these tests three times a year which enables us to monitor the progress of each student, not even just within a grade level but also over the years. We want to ensure that each student and each class continues to grow academically.

The tests cover the three core learning areas: reading, language, and mathematics. Even within those categories, students receive scores on sub categories. All of this means that teachers receive a flurry of information that helps us better understand the working level of each student and teach to that level. It may help us create working groups for class assignments, either at a student's level or within a variety of levels to support each other. There are a number of ways we utilize and adapt based on these results.

Communicating results to parents is difficult because they are so individualized, and they use educational statistics that are not commonly understood. The best we can do is share results with you during parent-teacher conferences.

MAP results have been a useful tool for us. We value the results.

<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

I hope that you all had a blessed Thanksgiving weekend and were able to celebrate God's goodness to us, even if celebrations looked different than other years. This week we will be looking at pumpkins and what is inside a pumpkin. We will be decorating foam pumpkins and learning the rhyme "Five Little Pumpkins".

Our **focus letter** this week is the letter Bb and we will learn the Jolly Phonics song for B. We will be using our Handwriting Without Tears workbooks for the first time to trace shapes.

In **math** this week, we will be introduced to probability with the lesson "Could it Happen?" We will also practice counting by counting who is in our families.

In **Bible**, we will complete our first unit by learning about the flood and the rainbow. Then we will begin a new unit about Abraham and God's promise to him.

In Health, we will learn more about the feelings happy and angry.

Tuesday will be our first **Library** day. Students will be able to choose a book from a selection provided to us from the library and will be able to take the book home for 2 weeks before returning it to choose a new book.

I hope everyone had a good Thanksgiving weekend! Some of the things we were thankful for last week were Mom and Dad, my dog, my toys, food, Oma, my baby brother, my baby sister...This week we continue on with counting our blessings.

In **language arts**, we are learning to count the number of words per sentence and learning that a sentence tells us something. We are focusing on letters S, T, and U. We will continue to practice our rhyming skills.

This week our new **sight word** is "see". Please keep on reading the sight word books and pre decodable readers with your child. In **math**, we are learning to print the numbers 1, 2, and 3 and learning to count objects one by one. This week we will add numbers 4 and 5.

In **Bible**, we will learn about Noah and the ark with an emphasis on God keeping His promises.

For our **Fall unit**, we will learn about apples and see what apple we like the best. Will it be a green granny smith, a red royal gala or a yellow delicious apple? Have a great week!

We are exploring more "i" Word Families like endings -in, -id, -ig, - ip, -it.

We are adding to our **Memory Verse**, Mark 12:30-31: "Love the Lord with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

In **Bible**, we are learning about The Call of Abram, and Lot's Choice.

In **math**, we seem to understand that "teen" numbers start with a 1, which means they have a group of 10. Hurray! Please exaggerate that there is a major difference between numbers like eighteen and eighty. We will continue to solidify this concept all year long. We are also working on addition. Students are using number lines and 10 Frames to solve addition equations. It is so exciting to see them develop this life long skill. I will also introduce the concept of subtraction and analogue clocks this week.

<u>Grade 2 – Mrs. Dykstra</u>

My hope and prayer was that everyone had a wonderful Thanksgiving weekend.

Bible: Memory words due Wednesday, October 21: Psalm 105:4 (NIV) "Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always." This week we will be creating dramatizations of the cycle of Judges. We will wonder about what we can learn from the book of Judges in light of Jesus' death and resurrection.

We have a few craft activities we did not finish last week that we will get to enjoy to solidify our learning.

Math: Number words to twenty and ordinal numbers will be our focus this week.

Language: We are building our reading habits and continue participating in small book clubs (guided reading). Writing lessons: *Catch a Small Moment: Writing Small Moment Stories with Independence.* We are "zooming in" from our planning stages to working on writing personal narratives. In grammar, we will be talking about and playing games with compound words and capitalization. In word work, we will be studying blends and digraphs through a variety of activities.

Spelling words for Friday, October 16: up, it, him, I, for, or, for, we, man, men.

Sight words (bonus spelling words): been, does, off, five Creation Studies: Last week students completed a short assessment for our unit on Matter in God's World and it is coming home today. Our cargo carrying contest takes place today! Whose boat will hold the most cargo?

Welcome back after a nice long weekend where we could reflect on what we were thankful for.

MAP testing is complete for most students. I just need to test those who were absent on a testing day.

In math, we are continuing our work on skip counting by 2s, 5, and 10s. We will end the week including 3s and 4s in our skip counting. We have been noticing patterns in the ones digits when we skip count.

In **Bible**, we are ending our unit on God's Laws. On Friday, we will be going through the review sheets and students should expect a test the following Monday.

In science, we have discovered why leaves change colour. We will be having a quiz on Photosynthesis on Friday. We will fill in a review sheet together on Thursday for students to take home.
