From the Classrooms

<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

We are continuing in our look at all things fall this week and will be exploring apples. We will make art using apples as stamps and we will taste different colours of apples to see which is our favourite. We will also be reading some stories about apples.

Our focus letter this week is Cc. We will learn the Jolly Phonics song for letter C. To practice recognizing letters, we will be singing the alphabet while pointing to the letters in our workbooks.

In Bible, we will learn about Isaac, and also Jacob and Esau.

In **math**, this week we will be doing lots of counting. We will practice counting on our bodies (2 eyes, 2 ears, 5 fingers, etc.) and we will use objects in the classroom to count.

On Thursday, we will be tasting different colours of apples and find out which colour is our favourite and which colour the class likes best.

Next week Tuesday (October 27) is our library day so please return books to the school so students can choose a new book to enjoy for 2 weeks.

Next week Thursday (October 29) there is no school because of the teacher convention.

<u> Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

This week we will focus on the letters V, W, X and Y. Wow! We have been reviewing how to print the letters and the sounds that they make. SK has worked hard! This week we will continue to rhyme words with "at" and "it". We are learning to identify how many words in a sentence and what the sentence is telling us. We are also learning that words have to be in a certain order to make sense. Our new sight word this week: "is".

In **Bible**, we will finish up the story of Noah and how God always keeps His promises. The Tower of Babel will wrap up our second unit.

In **math**, we are working on printing and recognizing numbers 1 to 5 and measuring using items such as unifix cubes, pumpkins, and links.

For our theme, we will focus on apples. We will make applesauce and taste various kinds of apples. We will also make leaf rubbings and create our own Leaf Man.

Friday is WACKY MASK DAY!!! Decorate a mask with drawings, jingle bells or anything that you can think of. JOIN in for our SPIRIT DAY activity.

Grade 2 – Mrs. Dykstra

Our Seesaw page is updated regularly - just a reminder to check in every so often for classroom photos and learning. Let me know if you need any help accessing your child's account. Due to a selfless, caring decision from a classmate, we all enjoyed a bucket party on Friday - it was a "fast forward" filling of our pom pom jar - all due to loving like Jesus!

Bible: Memory words due this Wednesday (Oct 21): Psalm 105:4 (NIV) "Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always." As we study the cycle of the Judges, students are creating dramas focusing on Eli, Samson, Gideon and Deborah.

Math: Ordinal numbers are relational and quite abstract; accordingly, we will continue this and number word practice for another week, followed by simple word problems. We try a different number sense routine daily and they include: secret number of the week, how many ways, counting circle, Esti-mysteries, Greg Tang games, and three-act tasks.

Language: Book clubs (guided reading) are bringing our reading strategies to life! I am reminding students to try as many strategies as it takes when they come to a "tricky word." New reading habits for the week: reread to see more and reread to make your voice sound smooth. Working in our leveled book clubs helps to practice with support. In writing, we are nearing the publishing stages of our small moment stories. Students are really starting to understand how to "zoom in" on a small moment to create detail in their personal narratives. In word work, I will introduce "Words Their Way" sorts, which will help to differentiate our phonics lessons.

This week we will learn the routines by sorting some beginning consonant sounds.

Spelling words (number words to twenty) for Friday, October 23: eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen, seventeen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty.

Sight words (bonus spelling words): around, first, sleep, tell, which **Creation Studies**: We are transitioning to mapping skills in our next unit, Naming the World God Made. We will practice positional words and then we will be "looking down" with a bird's eye view in order to map the tops of our desks and our classroom. This unit promises to be a wonderful way to connect to our yearly theme of "Who is my Neighbour? Learning to love like Jesus!"

French: We have been practicing our basic greetings and using our counting in a "real world" way by playing math games en francais! This week we will review colours.

Grade 3 - Mrs. Claus

I'm looking forward to a full week of learning!

Our **Bible** test will be tomorrow, Tuesday, October 20. It will be on our unit about God's Law, We did a review sheet on Friday. Our duotangs went home over the weekend to study. Today we will be doing a review game.

In science, we will be learning about seeds and reviewing for our test next week.



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Grade 5 and 6 – Mr. Katerberg

In **Bible**, we have started a new unit on the book of Daniel. Memory work this week is Daniel 2:44. In **math**, we are working on a unit entitled "Whole Numbers". The times tables are coming along very well for most. This week we will spend on division, especially long division.

Our first social studies unit is "From Far and Wide", a unit on Canada and its wealth of resources. We enjoyed the ghost town presentations on Friday and have a couple more to go. This week's focus will focus on Canada's multi ethnic heritage.
