#### Principal's Corner

Last Thursday was an unusual day. Instead of commuting to Ancaster, we all arrived at LCS, rolled some comfortable chairs into Mrs. Delleman's classroom, sat socially distant and masked, and listened to four workshops. Schools across the province, and even around the world, tuned in and sent pictures of how and where they were watching. Even just to see those pictures reminded us that Christian education is bigger than LCS and we are a part of a larger, growing, Christian school movement. The theme of the conference was Open Doors. We were first introduced to the concept of a window where we could view the world around us but maybe not be too involved in it. However, we were challenged to move to the concept of a door and open doors for our students to allow and enable them to move beyond our school walls and enter their neighbourhood. We want students to hear, see, and be engaged with different opinions, perspectives, and cultures while being grounded in their purpose as a Christian. We want them to see everyone as being created by God and like God, to see them as our neighbours, to reach out to befriend them, and get to know them – really know and care for them. As is our theme, the parable of the Good Samaritan was a basis for the discussions. The idea that the Samaritan didn't just rescue the traveler but came back to ensure he was okay later reminded us that true caring is not just a one-time thing but happens over time.

Some of the statements that stuck with me were "The message we give is not always what we say but it is who we are", "Our role as schools is to take disconnections and make connections", "School gives you new things to love because it exposes you to variety", and "To truly know our students and neighbours we have to approach them, create conversation with them, and accompany them". Each of these statements could carry a whole discussion by themselves but I leave them with you to think about.

Thursday made me think about not only opening the doors of LCS and allowing people in, but also thinking about what is outside the doors for us to enter. Who is out there waiting for LCS to know them?

I hope that everyone enjoyed some days off from school! This week we will have a full week of school. We will be focusing on the letters Ss and Mm. We will be listening to words to see if they have a "s" or "m" as the beginning sound, we will practice printing these letters and learn to blend parts of words together. Everyday we rhyme words to tune our ears to hear the rhymes. We will be reviewing the sight words that we have learned so far this year. The more practice we have with them we will be able to remember them

In **math**, we will wrap up our measurement unit and continue to practice print numbers 1 to 5.

#### Grade 1 - Ms. ten Brink

Creation Studies- Today is our last day looking at maps. Students have done great work over the last few weeks. Tomorrow we will start a unit on structures where we will look at God as the Master designer and how we can observe and copy his designs. I am looking forward to seeing the creativity in Grade 1 as they discover the form and function that objects can have

#### Grade 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

My first Ontario teachers' convention was inspiring. I valued the learning and connections with staff. I hope you enjoyed the days with your family.

Bible: We wrap up our Old Testament review with the divided kingdom and temple destruction. We have seen how many ways God provided and constantly forgave His people in the Old Testament (just like us). We prayed throughout this unit that we would look through God's eyes and obey Him, rather than go our own way with our own vision. Memory words to be tested Wednesday (Nov. 4) highlight how the Old Testament is another way to know God: "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path."

Math: We will spend a few more days on word problems. We continue to play games for facts practice to 20. After that, a new unit awaits us. God made patterns in the world for us to find! We begin by sorting by 2 or more attributes.

Language: Reader's Workshop final reading habit: set goals! In Writing Workshop, we will write some how-to stories as a class. Grammar: Punctuation practice continues as we analyze sentences and practice using our grammar skills in context, even in math! This week in spelling, we will review "w" words that most students are misspelling in their daily writing. Words are posted to Spelling City for game practice: where, went, what, with, who, were, when, which, why, was. Sight words (I know it in 3 seconds or less): before, don't, found, its, right (also bonus spelling words). Word Work: "Th" blend.

Creation Studies: We are fine tuning our desk top maps. We will practice writing our addresses and map puzzles. Then we begin talking about belonging. Our world belongs to God! Where else do we belong? I look forward to learning more about each child through these activities.

French: We have begun our play for this year, Le Chat et la Lune, and we are working through gestured vocabulary as well as creating a small picture and word dictionary. Thank you for all the donation of classroom books for our "good fit" library. What a blessing our families are to our Grade Two discovery of words and reading.

#### Grade 3 - Mrs. Claus

Welcome back after a nice long weekend! I learned a lot over the two PD days and feel blessed for the opportunity.

Bible- We are finishing up our unit.

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#### Grade 4 - Mrs. Delleman

**Art** - NEXT WEEK students will be painting poppies on rocks to put around town. Each student needs to bring in a small rock to paint this week (the student should be able to hold it with one hand) so we have one for each student when we do Art next Monday.

Cursive - NO Cursive due this week.

**Spelling** - Unit 7 Dictation FRIDAY - rode, cabin, sail, throat, camp, rope, said, know, boats, blow, alone, float, own, closed - long O sounds (oa, oe, ow)

Memory Work - 2 Kings 2:11 - "As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind." - due FRIDAY Math - On THURSDAY we will have a Math quiz on shapes. Students have been studying congruent and similar shapes, as well as quadrilaterals and prisms/pyramids. On Wednesday students will take home their duotangs to study and I will send home Smartboard notes as well.

Math (I KNOW IT) - Polygon Assignment due FRIDAY - Go to iknowit.com and have students log in (their username is the first four letters of their first name, and the first four letters of their last name, no spaces or capitals - the class code AND password is lcs12345). Students will then see the assignment that they need to complete. This week their assignment is on polygons (naming shapes and number of sides, parallel lines, and angles). #### Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Katerberg

In Bible, we are starting a new unit on the book of Esther. Memory work for Friday is Esther 4:14.

In **math**, we are working on a unit entitled "Whole Numbers". We will try a practice test today, review on Tuesday, and the final test on Wednesday.

In science, we will be introduced to our biodiversity unit.

**Spelling** lesson 7 assignment to be completed by Wednesday and we will have our unit 7 spelling test on Friday.

PE is on Monday and Wednesday, please have PE clothes (shorts and T-shirt) at school for these days.

In literature, we have completed reading first novel, From Anna. This week we will complete a review and get started on our final task. Our Final Task is due today, November 2. Students will create tests for each other today.

In writing, students are working on writing a journal response to "From Anna".

For art, students are asked to bring in at least five smooth stones (5 - 10 cm in diameter) to paint on. Please have stone washed and at school by Thursday.

#### Grade 5 and 6 - Mrs. Vogel

**French** - We continue to work on remembering familiar words while learning some new ones associated with the play we are studying.

#### Grade 7 and 8 - Mrs. Vogel

**Bible** - We continue to look at Paul's Missionary journeys. Memory Work is Galatians 5:13-18 and is due November 6. **Geography** - The students should receive their tests back by the end of this week. They need to be signed and returned to me.

**History** - We get to start our first history unit of the year. For grade 7 this is a bit different as they are used to having geography and history combined as social studies. We begin by looking at Ancient Rome.

French - We are continuing our unit "C'est moi".

Guided Reading - Quiz on 1st 2 chapters on Wednesday, November 4.

**Writing** - We are sharing our stories of remembrance as well as continuing into our last project dealing with editing and revising.

Working with Words - Unit 5 work due and test on Friday, November 6.

**Art** - We are going to be painting rocks this week for Remembrance Day - if your child(ren) has not brought in a rock yet, please do so by Wednesday.

#### Grade 7 and 8 - Mr. Boelens

**Math:** Monday we will do the unit reviews in preparation for the test on Tuesday. Our next units will be fractions and decimals.

**Gym:** If the weather looks good, we will go outside for ultimate frisbee or handball. If not, we will stay inside for handball or dodgeball. Next week – volleyball.

#### Grade 7 and 8 - Mr. Katerberg
