Principal's Corner

Learning happens most effectively when the learning engages more senses. If we simply use textbooks, we use sight. If we have discussions, we use hearing. If we combine the two – a reading with a discussion, the opportunity to learn increases. If we add a third, such as touch or smell, the ability to understand a concept increases dramatically.

If you are on Facebook you would have recently seen classes involved in learning using a variety of senses. The Kindergarten students build trains throughout the classroom - students communicating (talking and hearing) and touching as they design and implement their ideas.

There is no better way to determine if an idea works than to try it out and see for yourself. The Grade 2 class is building their little towns – understanding maps, directions, and town structures using hands on models. Again, the concept of turning left, turning right, the town Post Office, the farm, and other landmarks become more real and better understood when talked about (talking and listening), seen, and touched. The Grade 1 class is building structures – a hands on activity to experiment with ideas they heard in class. The Grade 7-8 class was also building structures to test their ideas of strength and the power of wind velocity. The Grade 7-8 class created models of Roman villages to solidify ideas they discussed in class. How better to understand the importance of water supply to a village than to physically trace the water's path into your model village.

While we experiment with teaching and learning, it is fun to observe students engaged with multiple senses. As I wander through classrooms and listen to students discuss (debate and sometimes argue) their ideas, test them, draw conclusions, and ultimately determine what is best, I see good learning practices.

Never a dull moment – always some fun activities. We enjoy in-person schooling!

This week we will review letters S, M and P. Please bring in a show and tell item that begins with one of these letters for Monday. All students are encouraged to participate. We will be working with short words and long words, the number of letters per word, sorting by the number of syllables and begin to learn some colour words. Our new sight word this week is "and". We will refer to it as our connecting word.

In math, we will be using shapes to make a shape monster, playing shape bingo and printing numbers to 10.

Writing report cards this past week allowed me to gather qualitative and quantitative assessments and observations. It was so valuable for me to reflect on your student's progress. I look forward to discussing this with you during Parent-Teacher Conferences. The schedule will be going out later this week. Please let me know whether you prefer to meet over Zoom or the Phone. This week, we are focusing on the following:

Spelling Words: net, pet, ten, pen, leg, beg. This is our first week doing spelling words. We will have a spelling test on Friday. Students are expected to WRITE these words. If they really struggle to write, they can say the spelling out loud to me at a different time. Please practice at home to increase our student's chances of learning how to spell.

Sight Words: two, or, before, eat, again, play, who, been, may, stop, off

Memory Verse: Hebrews 13:16 "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." **Bible**: This week we are continuing to learn about Joseph's story (Genesis 37 - 43).

Math: We continue to explore the different ways to represent numbers (words, tallies, fingers, objects, drawings, number line, base 10 blocks, a ten frame, dice dots, etc). We will begin to use our organization skills for Data Management and Probability, as well as 2D and 3D Geometry.

Grade 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

Report cards gave the opportunity to celebrate the good growth each God-gifted student has achieved this term. When you receive it in a week, I pray that the constructive feedback I provide will be seen as a window into knowing your child and believing in their abilities. Don't forget to check out the Spirit Day information - Friday is the big day!

Bible: This month our memory words are from Malachi 3:1, to be tested Wednesday, December 2 (version on Seesaw). We will create dramas this week on the four Jewish groups found in the intertestamental period.

Math: A short assessment on patterning problem solving to begin our week; then, we are off to a new unit on non-standard measurement.

Language: We launch a new unit in Reader's Workshop: Word Detectives! Our first mission from the Super Secret Detective Agency is to notice a problem and stop to solve it. In Writing Workshop, we learned about taking our illustrations from good to WOW by having characters move and talk. Students are finishing up a good copy of their how-to piece and adding some amazing illustrations to enhance their writing.

Spelling: Words to be tested Friday, November 27: be, see, got, she, sheep, shop, queen, green, bee, been. Sight words: sing, both, your (bonus spelling words).

Word Work: I vowel sounds and the "ai" and "ay" vowel teams. We will shift our focus to responsibilities in community, at school, and in our homes.
