### Principal's Corner

Today you have the opportunity to receive your child's report card. As you can imagine, these can be anxious times. Students wonder how teachers view their progress, what marks will they get, or what will he/she say about me. How will my parents interpret the report? Will they be pleased? Parents wonder how their child is doing. Are they keeping up? Are they fitting in? Are they behaving? Do they have friends? Will they graduate? How does this report card direct their future? Big questions. As you open your envelope and read the reports, remember that these reports represent a time in your child's life. They are young, they are growing, they are finding their gifts, and they are developing into what God wants them to be. Every child is different. Expect and celebrate that your children will have different report cards because they are created uniquely. Expect and celebrate that your child's report card will be different than their friend's or relative's because they are uniquely created.

I hope that you will spend some individual time with your child and review the whole report. What can you celebrate? What is going well and how does that reflect how God has created them? What areas show opportunities for more focus and growth? Are there changes that could be set in place to support your child's growth? How can you use this report card to set some goals and/or direction for term 2?

We hope these report cards are encouragement. A growth mindset says, "we haven't arrived <u>yet</u>" and we hope these reports give the same message. Like signposts on a journey, they may encourage you, but they also may redirect you. Your child is on a journey, they aren't there yet, but maybe these reports will give direction.

Enjoy them.

# From the Classrooms

#### <u>Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

As we greet December this week JK will be focusing on Christmas! We will be making some Angel themed art this week and will begin to learn and sing Away in a Manger. On Thursday we will do an experiment using candy canes.

Our **focus letter** this week is Ii, and we will learn the Jolly Phonics song for Ii. In our workbooks we will practice tracing and counting lines and learn how to print uppercase L.

In math, we will begin a new unit on patterns. We will look around us for patterns and learn about different kinds of patterns. Our new focus number is 4, our colour is green and our shape is the triangle.

In **Bible**, we will read more about David and his songs and Psalms. Our new **memory verse** is Luke 2:11 "Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord".

Library: We did not have the opportunity to choose new books last week. We will have the chance again next week.

Envelopes: I am sending quite a bit of work home in student envelopes this week. This is work I would have shown you during parent teacher interviews in the class. I hope you enjoy their creations and first journals! Interviews: I am looking forward to connecting with each of you during our Zoom/phone interviews Thursday and Friday.

#### Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on letter Hh and Tt. We will sort by number of syllables, rhyme words and continue to look at the different parts of a sentence. Our new sight word is "can". We will all create an "I can sentence" as a way of working towards a goal that each student would like to strengthen.

Please read with your child 10 mins a day. It doesn't matter if they read to you or you read to them. It is such a great way to connect with your child and exposes them to a variety of vocabulary. In math, we are printing numbers to 10 and learning counting strategies so that we count each item we need to. These strategies include moving the object being counted to putting a dot on it when you are counting a group of objects on paper.

In **Bible**, we started our Christmas learning about the surprise of the birth of John the Baptist to Zachariah and Elizabeth. This week we will continue with Mary and Joseph's surprise visitor and news. Our **memory work** is Isaiah 9:6 and we are working on our virtual portion of our Christmas performance.

In health, we are learning the difference between asking for help and tattling. A hard lesson for this age. The students are being encouraged to solve problems by thinking about the 2 ways I offer to help them deal with things such as name calling, butting in line, someone taking a toy from you, etc.

**Library** books go home on Monday and need to be returned by Friday Dec.11th, 2020.

Parent/teacher conferences by Zoom will be on Thursday at your scheduled time. If you prefer to have a phone call, let me know. I am flexible. A link will be sent to you on Wednesday. NO SCHOOL Friday.

#### Grade 1 - Mrs. Duiella Boekestyn

This week is a short one because Friday is a PA Day. Please have your students practice their spelling words and sight words at home. We will assess spelling words on Thursday. I look forward to speaking with you this Thursday or Friday.

Spelling Words: bat, fan, sad, lap, rag, flag, pat, van, wag, leg Sight Words: never, seven, eight, cold, today, fly, myself, round, tell, much, keep

Memory Verse: Philippians 2:4, "Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too."

**Bible**: We are finishing up our unit on Joseph before we explore Prayers of Petition, Prayers of Praise, Psalm of Supplication and Bible readings of the Christmas story.

Bible: Malachi 3:1 will be tested orally on Wed, Dec. 2. Our Seek and Find Advent devotions as well as our Christmas assembly project are the focus for December.

Math: Non-standard measurement activities, as well as facts practice

Language: Our word detectives are on the case! Our second mission from the Super Secret Detective Agency is to look CLOSELY to get clues. Writing Workshop: we are writing cards to our neighbours near the school and making cards for VON. Spelling: We are moving our spelling test to next Friday due to the short week and our Christmas assembly project. Words to be tested Friday, December 11th: no, go, going, most, kind, find, gave, so, do, doing. Sight words: buy, sit, those, wash (bonus spelling words). **Spelling** - Unit 10 Dictation NEXT Friday - dream, rest, please, friend, they, sleeping, chief, creek, piece, meet, believe, teach, yard, leave - Long E (ee, ea)

Math - We have finished our unit on multiplication and division and will be reviewing all week for our quiz on THURSDAY. Students need to know basic multiplication and division facts, how to multiply with zeros and 2-digit by 1-digit, and how to divide (counting, draw/divide, short division). Students will take home their duotangs and I will send Smartboard notes home on Wednesday.
