<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

I want to thank you for the well wishes and cards for my birthday last week and thank you to Melissa Stege for bringing in treats to share! I enjoyed celebrating with the class. We are in our last week of February already! We will be making more heart art this week using paint and toilet paper rolls to stamp heart shapes. This week our **focus letter is Ss**. We will learn the Jolly Phonics song for letter S.

We had fun with our special guest last week, Magic C Bunny! He was very shy but helped us learn to print letters C, O, Q and G in our workbooks. We will be printing letters S, J and D in our workbooks this week. In **Bible**, we will conclude our unit "Stories about Jesus" by learning about how Jesus helped people who do wrong. We will begin a new unit on Thursday called "Jesus Teaches His People" with the lesson The Good Shepherd.

In **math**, we will continue our measurement unit by exploring capacity. We will look at different containers and try to guess which one will hold more.

In **health**, we will learn more about families and how we don't always get along and sometimes we need to forgive each other.

<u> Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

This week our focus letters will be Kk and short vowel Ee. Students are welcome to bring a show and tell on Tuesday that begins with the letter K. We continue to work on hearing the sounds in short 3 letters words and we pull them slowly out of our mouth. We are using our listening skills to hear the last sound in a word. This week our sight word is "for" and we will be reading a reader titled "For You". In math, we are working on what number comes "before" another number. We are printing our numbers to 20 and counting objects to 30. Daily we review patterning in our morning job activities. In **Bible**, we will learn more about the Israelites as they travel through the desert and we will hear the 10 commandments and why we still need them today. We celebrated the freedom of the Israelites from the Egyptians by dancing and playing musical instruments and reciting our memory work from Exodus 15:2a. What a mighty God we serve! A scholastic book order has been sent home. Please feel free to order and use our class code so that we can purchase some new books for our classroom. Students will have an opportunity to take a library book home on Monday, so please return any books that are still outstanding. Have a great week!

Grade 1 - Mrs. Duiella Boekestyn

And BAM! Just like that, we are finishing off February. **Bible:** We are on the trajectory of wrapping up our Moses unit by studying the Tabernacle, Spies in the Land (Numbers 13-14), Wilderness Wanderings (Numbers 20:1-21:9) and his death (Deuteronomy 31-34). We will not get through all of this in one week but this is where we are headed.

Bible Verse: We will be working on the same bible verse. "Romans twelve verse eighteen. If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone."

Language: Last week, I introduced the difference between long and short vowel sounds. We will continue to explore these sounds and letters. Additionally, as we continue to write books of our goals, we will continue to think about our strengths and struggles in reading, writing, math, and for being a good neighbour.

Spelling Words: We are working on the same spelling words, especially differentiating between "b" and "d". There will be a test on Friday. The words are; sad, bed, crab, blob, had, shed, pad, cob, red, bad.

Sight Words: As mentioned last week, we are going to be tackling some of the tricky sight words we have learned in the past. We are focusing on the same tricksters as last week; they, were, of, know, their, want, out, live, its, run, with

Math: I intend to do some review of math concepts this week and some assessments. We will practice communicating our knowledge of 2D and 3D shapes, 1 more and 1 less, area and perimeter, bonds that 5 (5 and 0, 4 and 1, 3 and 2, and reverse), and addition and subtraction. On Tuesday, all math will be related to the number 100!

100th Day of School: Well, we sure are getting some real-life experience with adding "one more" to our calendar forecasting. Due to snow days, our 100th day of school has changed again. **Now**

We are working through the unit: Jesus Preaches, discovering who Jesus is and all the beautiful names for Him we find in the Bible.
