Some advanced significantly in their ability to read, some focused on their math skills, some paid attention to their need to use class time more efficiently or hand in completed work on time. Regardless of the person, there was always some progress to celebrate. With the term I marks to compare, I hope you find some of those areas for your child. Are there areas where they are consistently strong, and they managed to maintain that strength? Are there areas where they struggle but they showed endurance and kept pace with their expectations? Celebrate those for it is not always easy for your child.

Sometimes the academic section of the report card doesn't fully represent the growth of a child. Have they grown in their ability to show their faith while at school, or work independently, or work in collaboration with their classmates, or develop a higher level of responsibility? Those are life traits or character traits that we also value enough to report on and students with gifts in these areas should be honoured as well.

When I read through each report card there were also noted areas for improvement. As you reflect on the two terms, what area would you like to see improve on the term 3 report? Set some goals or targets with your child. What steps have to be taken in order to accomplish that goal? Help your child grow as a student and as a person by reflecting with them.

We pray that tonight will be a good night in your family. Receive these report cards, spend time with them, and celebrate the child God has given you.

We will wrap up our Nursery Rhyme unit this week and begin a new unit on Spring and Easter. We will be making some artwork that will go in the Communicator.

Tuesday is Library day for JK. Please remember to send in library books!

Our focus letter this week is X. We will learn the Jolly Phonics song for letter X and practice the sound that it makes.

In our workbooks, we will be reviewing the uppercase letters.

In **math**, we are learning about different representations of numbers, for example the numeral 7 can be shown by holding up 7 fingers or a group of 7 objects.

Our focus number for April is 8 and our focus colours are purple and brown.

In **Bible**, we will begin our Easter unit and learn about Palm Sunday and the Lord's Supper. We will have a new memory verse for April, Luke 24:6a "He is not here; He has risen!"

In health, we will continue our Five Senses unit by exploring our sense of hearing.

Bible Verse: We are continuing to memorize pieces of the Easter story. We continue Matthew 28 with verse 7 and 8. Math: Subtraction, beginning to disscus the basics of multiplication (for example, 2 groups of 3, 3 groups of 3)

Language: We continue to practice procedure writing with independence.

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Math: Our new unit on skip counting helps students see patterns in numbers as well as lays a great foundation for number sense and learning the multiplication facts. Students will learn to skip count forwards and backwards by 2s, 5s, and 10s within 100, starting from any number in the case of 2s and 10s, and starting from a multiple of 5 in the case of 5s.

Spelling Words: With 2 short weeks upon us, the spelling test will be Friday, April 9. New word lists are posted on Seesaw and Spelling City. *Bossy r* is our phonics focus (ar, or, er, ir, ur).

Reader's Workshop and Writer's Workshop: Focus will be on writing about Easter. In reading, we will be enjoying the wonderful fractured fairy tales each student completed!

Creation Studies: Simply Marvelous Machines - quiz on Wednesday, March 31. Study sheet and mini-book sent home today. We did some practice questions today in class.

PE - This week, we will record our creative movement song "Light of the World." Students did a wonderful job learning the actions with ribbons.

French - Numbers and colours quiz will be on Thursday. Colours to be quizzed are: blanc, bleu, gris, jaune, brun, noir, orange, rose, rouge, vert, violet. Counting 1-20 will also be orally assessed.
