# From the Classrooms

#### <u>Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

I hope and pray that you were all able to spend the weekend rejoicing in the gift of our Beautiful Saviour and his great love for us!

This week we will be planting two kinds of seeds, flower and bean seeds. Then we will wait and watch to see them grow!

This week our **focus letter is Yy**. We will learn the Jolly Phonics song for letter Y.

In our workbooks, we will continue our review of the Alphabet by matching upper and lowercase letters. In math, we will be learning about and practicing estimating. We will also begin practicing printing numbers. In Bible, we will learn more about Easter with the stories of Jesus' Arrest, Peter's Denial and the Cross and

Resurrection.

In health, we will be learning about our sense of taste and how we can taste sweet, sour, bitter and salty things.

## Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will be introduced to the long vowel O sound and continue to review the short and long vowel sounds of Aa and Ii. In **math**, we are working with teen numbers on ten frames with our math partners. We are learning to identify 10 and to count from there. In **Bible**, we will learn about Jesus' ascension to heaven and review the meaning of Easter.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we are printing lowercase letters and will be introduced to lowercase "u". We are learning how to print a sentence using "The Sentence Song".

We will be learning about the water cycle and why it rains. We will be doing our own raining experiment on Thursday.

## Grade 1 - Mrs. Duiella Boekestyn

He has risen!! Woo hoo! For the next four days before Spring Break we will continue with the same spelling words. There will be a spelling test on Friday. We have new sight words and new Bible verses to add to our memories.

**Spelling Words**: scab, scar, scold, scrap, snow, snap, snip, swim, sway, sweep.

**Sight Words**: twelve, twenty, thirteen, seventeen, sixteen, eleven, eighteen, nineteen, fourteen, fifteen, numbers

Bible Verse: Matthew 28: 17-19 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations"

Math: Please continue to practice counting back from 20. In class, we are working on recognizing the number with the number in words (1 is one, 2 is two, 13 is thirteen, etc), as well as subtraction, and the various ways to make 5.

## Grade 1 - Ms. ten Brink

Creation Studies - Last week we finished off the week with reusing materials to create something new. It was wonderful to see the creativity in Grade 1!. This week we will start our new unit, The Sky Declares, looking at how the sky proclaims the handiwork of God. Over the next few weeks we will look at the seasons, weather, the sun, and clouds.

Also, a number of projects that we have worked on are going home today. Students have been asking to be able to share them with you, so I hope you are able to take a moment and let them share them with you. These do not need to come back to school.

#### Grade 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

He is Risen! I hope and pray you had a wonderful weekend celebrating our mighty Saviour. While it is a short week, we have fresh and exciting units of learning to begin.

**Bible** - review of Passover, Resurrection and various appearances by our risen Jesus. There is **no** memory test this week. We will commit to memory the words from Romans 5:6 AND 8 for **Wednesday April 28** ("You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly...But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.")

Math: Last week students learned to skip count forwards and backwards by 2s, 5s, and 10s within 100, starting from any number in the case of 2s and 10s, and starting from a multiple of 5 in the case of 5s. We will play more "catch" this week with our skip counting, focusing on the tricky skill of counting backwards by 2's. Unit quiz is planned for Thursday.
