From the Classrooms

<u>Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

It is October and we will begin a **new fall theme**. This month we will be exploring corn, pumpkins and apples! This week we will be painting with corn cobs and also seeing if we can sprout corn on the cob.

In **language**, we are beginning to look at each letter of the alphabet and practice recognizing the upper and lowercase letters with a search and find page. We will also practice the sound each letter makes using the Jolly Phonics songs. We will focus on one letter each week starting with letter A. This week we will also meet and draw "Mat Man" a character from our Handwriting Without Tears workbooks.

In math, we will be learning about graphs by using objects and then pictures to create a graph. Our new focus number is 2, our focus shape is a rectangle, and our focus colour is orange.

In our **Bible** lessons, we will read about how Adam and Eve disobeyed God, and also about Noah and the Ark. We have a new Bible verse for October, Genesis 28:15a "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go." We will also learn a new song "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands".

In health, we are going to learn about feelings starting with happy, angry, afraid and sad.

Grade 1 and 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

1. On Friday we began our "at-home" reading program. The purpose of this program is to encourage regular reading practice or listening to reading from a family member. In summary, each Friday your child will take home four books, and he/she will need to return all 4 books on Friday. The hope is that your child will read **OR** be read to a little on most weekdays. You were provided with a ziplock bag for transporting the books to and from school. Please use this bag to protect the books from getting wet (from water bottle spills and such). The reading does not have to be in the books provided - any and all reading counts! And yes, there are prizes. For every 20 minutes of reading OR being read to, a student can colour a bear on their page. When all the bears are coloured in and a parent initials, the sheet can be given to Mrs. D for a prize and a new sheet will be given. We love books and learning to read in Grade 1/2!

2. In **Bible** class, we are wrapping up our first unit with lessons on prayer as found in the Book of James. We don't need an appointment to talk to God; He is ready anytime, anyplace to pray to about anything! We have done well with our memory words from James 1:19. New words will be presented next week.

3. Language Arts

Spelling - words for green and blue groups will be tested this Friday (Oct. 8). If you need the list of words, please let me know. Red group friends are welcome to try the test of the green group words, if they desire. If you are interested, your child may use this link for Spelling City for games (also posted on Seesaw). Please ensure he/she is selecting the correct colour group for games.

Writing/reading - students were very engaged with sticker words and stories last week. Now we are on to reading *Elephant and Piggie* books as we complete an author study on *Mo Willems* and write our own comic style pages. We are working on s-l-o-w spelling each sound we hear in a word to spell without asking "how do you spell?" We are writers!

- 4. Creation Studies Simple Machines: God Made Things to Move. We will take a quick trip through this interactive unit and see how simple machines make jobs easier.
- 5. **PE/Health** we began a throwing and catching unit. We were our own partner in the gym that was funny! In **health**, we are talking about worry and will complete an activity based on the book *Wemberly Worried* by Kevin Henkes.

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We will continue practicing our reading of a little story: "Quelle est ta saison préférée?" (What is your favourite season?). We will also tackle some additional worksheets related to the seasons and weather.

Grade 7 and 8 – Ms. Van Kampen

MAP Testing: Reading and Writing will occur on Wednesday and Friday respectively.

Art: weather and time permitting (i.e. with MAP testing and rearrangement of our schedule), the plan is to be outdoors to undertake some sketching.

Bible: Our first unit is Themes of the Old Testament. Lesson#6 "The Beginning of God's People" reviews the early stages of God's plan of redemption, his program to restore his creation. Lesson #7 the "Patriarchs" and God's relationship with them and their descendants.

French: This week we will focus on expressions with avoir and then move on to être (to be).

Geography: our unit is entitled Physical Patterns in a Changing World. Students are currently engaged in group work to prepare a slide presentation on a particular land reclamation project (i.e. Dubai, China, Indonesia, or Netherlands) answering the 5W's + How, as well as the Social, Political, Economic, and Environmental impact of the respective project.

Guided Reading: Current novel study → "The Secret Garden". Last week, students listened to an oral reading of Chapter 5 but were to read Chapter 6 independently. Worksheets (with short answer and Word Work activities, as well as written summary requirements) were handed out Thursday and are due tomorrow. We will then proceed to Chapters 7&8.

Writing and Working With Words: This week's writing topic is "What Gifts and Skills God Has Given Me". Our word work will continue to focus on nouns as well as more editing/proofreading exercises.

Grade 7 and 8 - Mr. Boelens

Ottawa Trip: Very soon, I will begin to make arrangements for the Ottawa trip. I am targeting the week of Monday February 7 - Thursday February 10. When I begin to schedule things, only then will I fully understand what requirements will be in place for us to go. Until then, we will plan for the trip!
