<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

This week we will continue with our farm theme by making art using straw!

In **language** this week, we will practice reading each other's names and we will participate in a listening activity to see what different sounds we can recognize.

In **Bible**, we will learn more about creation, specifically about the creation of animals and humans. We will also talk about the Sabbath.

In **math**, we will be doing more sorting by looking into different stories. We will also create people graphs. In **health**, we will discuss how we all are the same, and also different.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will be introduced to the letters J, K, L and M. We are learning to listen for words that rhyme, participating in listening games such as Simon Says and the whisper game. We will focus on the sight word "the" by reading "The Beach". These readers will be coming home in Monday's envelope. These sight word readers are very rote and many students will "read" them by the given patterns. That is okay. Please help your child to track each word that they read by using their Peter Pointer finger, always going from left to right and following the gray dots. Help your child have reading success by making reading enjoyable. If they want you to read it, please do so.

In **math**, we are working on number recognition and printing of numbers from 1 to 5.

In **Bible**, we will wrap up the Creation unit by learning about Adam and Eve and the importance of Sabbath rest.

Grade 1 and 2 – Mrs. Dykstra

1. Next Monday, October 4, we will begin our "**at-home**" reading program. The purpose of this program is to encourage regular reading practice and a love for books. A ziplock bag, letter of expectations, and tracking chart (yes, there are reading prizes!) coming next week. 2. Library day is tomorrow - please ensure books are returned in the labeled bag.

3. Last week, we read many books. We discussed why writers write and parts of a sentence. So far, we've read books that made us laugh, helped us read, and tell us stories! We wrote about what we like, a "baguette" story (tehe), and are working daily at our handwriting program. I am sending home photocopies of writing pages as we are keeping the colour copies for our classroom books we are publishing together.

4. In **Bible** class, we have learned about how our words can heal and harm. We made post-it art displaying what it might look like to be a peacemaker like Jesus or what a peacebreaker might do. We are practicing James 1:19 together in class.

5. In **Grade One math**, we continually build our number sense through math games. We started using our math workbooks in our review of numbers to 10.

Spelling - We are still reviewing and practicing our spelling routines. Their word lists will be posted starting next week and dictation happens on Fridays.

Math - We have finished our first unit in Math and will be reviewing throughout the week for our test next week Wednesday. Smartboard notes (of what we have done in class) will be sent to parents to help students review and study for the quiz.

It has been a joy to meet and reconnect with all of the students in the school! Here are some things that we have been learning about in music. <u>Grade 5 and 6 – Mr. Siebenga</u>

This week we will pick up a few new units in **math** and **Bible**. We are moving on with Whole Numbers in math, and God's Story in the Bible. In **math**, I will be ushering out a "Basic Fact" practice activity that will work on strengthening the students retention of operational facts, working with them to quickly know these facts. This corresponds well with the unit on whole numbers, but will continue to be used throughout the year. With these two units the tests previously written will be returned. Please review these with your child, and discuss

accordingly. If you have questions, please feel free to reach out.

The memory work for this week will be 2 Timothy 3:16-17.

We have started our Literature Circles for the novel, "Mystery at Cranberry Farm." These will further investigate the themes, vocabulary, plot progressions, and literary details to help the students collaborate and share their ideas with their group. Our Social Studies unit carries on as we explore how we experience justice, our stake in the game, and what our obligations are.

The students are being introduced to a new **spelling program**, Words their Way. This will enable the students to be met at their spelling level.

Grade 5 and 6 – Ms. Van Kampen

French: This week we will continue our focus on the verb avoir (to have) and the plan is to have a quiz. We will also be practicing our reading of a little story: "Quelle est ta saison préférée?" (What is your favourite season?).

<u>Grade 7 and 8 – Ms. Van Kampen</u>

Bible: Our first unit is Themes of the Old Testament. Lesson #4 "The Conflict" centers around the meaning of Israel and is intended to connect students' personal faith journeys to the faith struggles of the people of Israel. Lesson #5 "Covenant" focuses on our relationship with God and his desire to have a relationship with us. Lesson#6 "The Beginning of God's People" reviews the early stages of God's plan of redemption, his program to restore his creation.

French: This week, we will continue to focus on the verb avoir (to have); the plan is to have a formal assessment by end-of-week. Students are expected to have the conjugations of this foundational verb "known by heart". **Geography:** Our unit is entitled Physical Patterns in a Changing World. Students have a World Map due tomorrow. This week's lesson deals with "Changes to Landforms".

Guided Reading: Current novel study → "The Secret Garden". Last week, students listened to an oral reading of Chapter 3 but were to read Chapter 4 independently. Worksheets were handed out Thursday and are due tomorrow. Note that Grade 8 received additional long-answer questions. This week we will deal with chapters 5 and 6.

Writing and Working With Words: Last week students were assigned a short writing piece entitled "My Goals for the Year"; final copy (computer generated) is due today. Our next writing topic is "What Gifts and Skills God Has Given Me". Our word work will continue to focus on nouns as well as editing/proofreading exercises.

Grade 7 and 8 – Mr. Boelens

Math: Both classes will finish off their introductory units. We will spend this week solidifying our understanding and our tests will be next week.

Gym: This week we will continue to hold gym outdoors and finish off our soccer unit.
