This week we will review the letter Hh and be introduced to the letter T. We will continue to sort by the number of syllables, rhyme words and blend sounds together. In printing, we will focus on the straight line uppercase letters of V, W, X, Y and Z. We will read our new sight word reader "I Play" and make a predictable chart using the word "I".

In math, we will be counting to 25, printing numbers to 10 and patterning. Students will be creating their own patterns using a variety of materials and actions.

Ask students about these, and look to practice certain groups of challenging questions depending on your students' needs. In science, the students have been eagerly designing their prototypes for their upcoming Engineering Contract Proposals. These Fantastic Flyer proposals are due next week Wednesday, December 15.
