So much for planning. Who can make plans in times like these? If it isn't the pandemic, then it is the weather.

When remote teaching became a teaching style, there were many discussions about snow days and remote teaching. Some statements were made that schools would no longer lose educational time because teachers could pivot to remote teaching on snow days. Education would seamlessly carry on. It isn't that easy. Plans teachers make for in-person teaching don't always adapt to remote teaching. Scrambling around first thing in the morning to create or re- create lesson plans doesn't always result in the best educational experiences. I never felt that remote teaching on snow days was the best idea. We never committed to that pivoting but we also have not had a snow day since remote teaching became an option.

Today, Monday, is the day. Monday, I asked staff to at least make a connection with students via remote teaching. Maybe they are just doing devotions, maybe their morning circle, maybe they are providing curriculum. Since we are just coming off of remote teaching, we have a practice in place that works. For future snow days, if they are one day in the middle of many in-person learning days, we will just take a snow day as a regular, non-teaching day. There are many things students also learn by being at home.

As well, also when it comes to planning, we have made plans for a PD day on Friday. This year Edvance has the theme of hospitality. On Friday, Sara Pot from Edvance will host two sessions with us. Sara's role with Edvance is to support schools in becoming schools of belonging, where every student feels cared for, loved, valued, appreciated, and that they belong at LCS. It is our hope that, through Sara's presentations, our staff is encouraged in our current practices and challenged to improve. In the meantime, it means your children will be home on Friday.

From the Classrooms

<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

I want to take this opportunity to thank you, parents, for your cooperation and hard work during our online learning these last two weeks. I am so happy to be back in the classroom with students this week! We will be continuing with our **winter theme** this week by creating mittens to help decorate our classroom. In **language**, we will be focusing on letter Nn and will learn the Jolly Phonics song for Nn. In our workbooks we will print letters T, I and U and we will learn about Magic C! We will also continue to learn about rhyming words. In **math**, we will continue exploring size, comparing items by how tall and how long they are. In **Bible**, this week we will learn about a girl named Esther and how she became Queen and helped to save the Jewish people.

In health, we will begin a new unit about our families.

Library Day- Just a reminder that Tuesday is library day. Please return any library books so students may choose new books.

<u> Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

This week we will be focusing on the beginning and middle sound of short vowel Ii. We will be reviewing the letters Hh, Tt, Nn and Ll. Our new sight word is "see". We will be doing lots of sorting by the number of syllables per word and working on our rhyming skills.

Students will be introduced to segmenting a two letter word, which means they will be encouraged to hear each letter sound.

In math, we are learning about measuring capacity and height. We will be counting to 30 and practice printing numbers to 15.

We will learn more about the different species of penguins and be making a penguin in art class.

In **Bible**, we will be reviewing what happening after Joseph's brothers threw him in the pit and sold him into slavery and learning how God helped Joseph to interpret the dreams of the cupbearer and the baker. Our memory work is Romans 8:28, "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose."

Grade 1 and 2 – Mrs. Dykstra

We praise God that we return in person this week! Please ensure your child has spare masks and extra socks in his/her backpack.

Bible: During online learning, we completed a portion of our unit on Jesus' ministry.

We will now look at how Jesus called his disciples, as well as the Sermon on the Mount this week. Our in-class memory words are Matthew 4:19: Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people."

Language Arts: "Learning about God's World through Non-fiction." Our reading and writing mini-lessons focus on this genre and how we can get super smart about non-fiction topics. Step one: filling our book boxes full of non-fiction books.

Phonics: We meet some characters to add to our strategies for reading. We read sounds, not letters! Lefty Larry (start at the left hand side of the word) and Grapheme Grasshopper (hop to each grapheme, left to right, and say EACH sound). We will focus on blends this week and next, to reinforce good reading habits.

Spelling words for testing Friday, February 4.

Orange (blends; 8 words total): twin, twine, twist, whip, wheel, quit, quiz, queen

Blue (blends): stop, step, star, stab, stem, stamp, shot, shop, shed, shin Green/red (cvc words): net, pet, set, get, leg, beg, ten, men, pen, hen

Creation Studies : Our unit is centered on Global Communities in God's World. The plan for the week is to talk about needs (and how God fulfills those daily), and discover more about the equator, hemispheres, continents, and oceans. Our goal for this unit is to see that God cares for all children of the world, "just like me!"

Grade One Math: Measurement lessons continue. I will undertake some one-one assessment with each Grade 1 student this week on the concepts in this unit.

Health: God's desire is for us to honour our bodies; thus, we look at what substance use, addiction, and related behaviours are (in a faith-based, age-appropriate manner).

Library day is tomorrow.

Grade 2 Math - Ms. ten Brink

We will be spending time in review this week to go over what was covered the last 2 weeks before moving on to learning our strategies for addition and subtraction using a number line. IKnowIt - Missing Numbers (Multiplication and Division up to 10s) - due THURSDAY

Math - We are going to have a quiz on THURSDAY on topics we have covered so far in our division unit. Students will need to know how to draw pictures and write equations for division facts, how to answer word problems, and how to find missing numbers in fact families. We will be reviewing in class in preparation for the quiz.
