Grade 1 and 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

I hope and pray you had a restful Christmas break. It is time to get back to it! **Bible**: Our guiding question this week is "What gifts can I give to Jesus?" Then we move onto a unit entitled "Jesus Begins His Ministry."

Language Arts: "Learning about God's World through Non-fiction." Our reading and writing mini-lessons focus on this genre and how we can get super smart about non-fiction topics. We will load our book boxes with non-fiction books to look at, enjoy, and for some, read!

Phonics: We meet some characters to encourage techniques to begin reading or improve on what we already read. We read sounds, not letters! Lefty Larry (start at the left hand side of the word) and Grapheme Grasshopper (hop to each grapheme, left to right, and say EACH sound).

Spelling words for testing Friday January 14 (Spelling City updated): Orange (blends): drip, drill, trap, blow, blue, blob, bled, tree, trip, trim Blue (blends): shin, shop, chin, chop, shed, ship, chat, chip, she, sheep Green/red (cvc words): top, cot, hot, dot, hop, mop, pop, log, jog, dog Creation Studies: We flip to a social studies unit on Global Communities. The plan for the week is to talk about needs (and how God fulfills those daily), and discover more about the equator, hemispheres, continents, and oceans. Our goal for this unit is to see that God cares for all children of the world, "just like me!"

Grade One Math: Measurement covers two topics: length and mass. We begin with direct comparisons (this pencil is longer than that pencil, this book is heavier than that piece of paper, and so on) and then move to indirect comparisons.

Physical Education: Animal tag games (no, we aren't inviting animals into the gym!)

Health: God's desire is for us to honour our bodies; thus, we look at what substance use, addiction, and related behaviours are (in a faith-based, age-appropriate manner).

Library day is tomorrow.

Grade 2 Math - Ms. ten Brink

Welcome back! It is good to be back at school after our break. We finished our unit on probability and data management just before the break and are starting on addition and subtraction with numbers to 100. This will hopefully be a review of using a hundreds chart, base ten blocks, ten-frames, and number lines for solving addition and subtraction questions.
