From the Classrooms

<u>Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

This week we will be focusing on Easter with our Bible lessons and also with some special Easter art projects. Our focus letter this week is letter Yy. We will focus on the sound letter y makes and recognizing upper and lowercase Yv.

In our workbooks, we will be finishing our review of capital letters and drawing Mat Man again! In math, we are going to be focusing on printing numbers. We will print numbers 1, 2, 3, and 4 this week. In Bible, we will read about Jesus' arrest, Peter's denial of Jesus, and Jesus' death on the cross and resurrection. In health, we will be focusing on our sense of touch.

Tuesday is Library day, remember to return last week's books so students can choose new books.

Thursday we will gather with the rest of the school to have an assembly.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will be focusing on long vowel A and sorting by long vowel A and short vowel A sounds. Our new sight word is "said". We will focus on listening for the phonetic sounds that make up a word as well as identifying ending sounds.

In math, we will learn how to skip count by 2s and focus on printing numbers without reversals. Students will be introduced to solid shapes such as spheres and cubes.

In **Handwriting** Without Tears, we will learn about diver letters that take a plunge and work their way back up to swim in another direction. These letters include Pp, Rr and Nn.

In Bible, we will learn about the crucifixion.

On Thursday we will gather for an assembly to celebrate the sacrifice of our Saviour. Please gather with the school community at 9:40am in the gym. Have a great day!

Grade 1 and 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

Only 4 resurrection eggs to find this week until the BIG golden egg is opened! In Bible class, we worked on our Passion Week Journal as we reflected on the stories.

Language Skills

Full group phonics: more blends! We will stick mostly with 2-letter blends; for extension I will introduce 3-letter blends. We will continue our word hunt and write down as many blends as we can when reading together or on our own. Reading & Writing: The book battle winner is The Three Little Gators! Our reading lessons going forward will be books and games featuring blends.

Grammar: We will focus on parts of speech for the next two weeks, mainly verbs and nouns. We also continue studying our new favourite grammar confusion: homophones. This is a tricky part of correct grammar - words that sound exactly the same but are totally different in meaning. We will create a poster illustrating different homophones.

Spelling: Lists are posted on Seesaw and Spelling City. Lists for Thursday April 14 Orange: blank, bleed, chart, chief, shore, shout, whine, where

Blue: dock, lock, buck, duck, neck, deck, tack, sack

Green: mad, nap, wet, web, did, rip, hut, bus

In Creation Studies, we studied precipitation and clouds last week. Students enjoyed our experiments: cloud in a jar, beaker of science evaporation, and frost jar. Now we explore water flow and why we need (and God provides) air and water to stay alive.

In Grade 1 Math, we ended our week with doubles days - we can add doubles! Going forward, we focus on skip counting backwards by 2s, and 5s (from 20 to 0), finding numbers in the hundred chart, and ordering numbers to 50.

Please remember that every **Tuesday** is our **library** day.

Grade 2 Math- Ms. ten Brink

We are in our second math book! Last week we moved onto our second book and have spent the last few days working on reviewing skip counting and will be moving on to discovering addition strategies later this week.

This week in the classroom:
