From the Classrooms

<u>Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

This week we will be making some butterfly art and keeping an eye on the growth of our seeds. Some of them have sprouted and are growing!

Since we have completed learning all of the letters of the alphabet, we will begin to review the letter names and sounds this week, starting with letters A-E.

We will also begin a new **Handwriting Without Tears** workbook called Kick Start Kindergarten where we will review printing uppercase letters and then, if time allows, begin printing lowercase letters.

In **math**, we will finish up in our old green Handwriting Without Tears workbooks to print numbers 8, 9 and 10. In **Bible**, we will read about Pentecost and Peter.

We completed our **health** unit celebrating God's gift of our five senses by making something that we could use all five senses to experience, popcorn!

Extra Clothes: If you have not sent back extra clothes after March Break, I ask that you please send in a set. As the weather is changing frequently we often end up with wet pants and socks after recess. I would also encourage you to send splash pants if you have them! Thanks!

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on the long vowel I sound by singing some silly songs, listening for vowel sounds and doing a vowel sort.

Our new sight word is little.

Students are learning how to build sentences.

In math, we will finish our 3D objects unit by learning about cylinders and cones. We will continue to work on counting by 2s and begin using positional words.

For **Handwriting Without Tears**, we are still working on diver letters such as lowercase h, b and f.

We continue to look for the position of the letters on a line.

In **Bible**, we will begin a unit called Jesus' Ministry and will learn about Jesus' baptism and how he called His disciples.

We are practicing our songs for Grandparent's Day on the stage. How exciting! We are learning about the difference between seeds and bulbs and the purpose of the roots, the stem, and the leaves of a plant.

In **Math**, the students have been working well with the Khan academy practice, in class applications, workbook expectations, and basic facts. For both grades, this week Friday is our Test on Fractions, Decimals, Percentages, and also Ratios for Grade 6.

In **Reading**, the "Underground to Canada" is going along well. The Literature Circle is operating with good results and is proving to be a space where the students can apply what they are reading while putting on many different hats to explore the diverse content of the novel.

In **Social Studies**, the mini American culture projects have been started with fervour. Completing them with the same enthusiasm will be the key. The students are to create an infographic using Canva, and complete one of the chosen projects from their particular lens on American culture. I look forward to these graphically charged representations of data, and their creative spirit to show what they have learned about their topic of American culture.
