From the Classrooms

<u>Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

It is April! We are going to be learning about Spring this month and the new life that is all around us, as well as the new life that Jesus can give us. We will plant seeds and watch them grow and we will be making some spring and Easter themed art as well.

Our focus letter this week is letter X. We will be practicing the sound letter x makes using the Jolly Phonics song and listening for letter x in words, and recognize that upper and lowercase X look the same! In our **workbooks** we continue to review capital letters.

In math, we will learn about estimating.

In Bible, we begin our Easter unit by reading about Palm Sunday and the Lord's Supper.

In health, we are continuing our Five Senses unit by learning about our sense of taste.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on the letters **Yy** and **Vv**. We will take some time to review the sounds of letters that we have already focused on. We are learning to hear the number of sounds in a word and identifying ending sounds. We will continue to work on reviewing sight words and learning the word "for". In **math**, we continue to count to 100 and sort items into three and/or four categories.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will print lowercase "K, Y and J", words on a line and practice printing a sentence.

In **Bible**, we will hear about Peter's denial of knowing Jesus and the crowds shouting "Crucify Him" Our memory verse is Matthew 28:5-6a-"The angel said to the woman, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here: He has risen."

We will learn a little about rain and rainbows as we complete a rain experiment. In **art**, we will learn how to draw flowers.

Grade 1 and 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

In **Bible** class, we did not begin our new unit due to the snow days and thus will start with the Triumphant Entry this week. We now create a Passion Week journal to remember Jesus' journey to the cross. In our devotions, we were humbled and awed by Jesus' suffering as we found a crown of thorns, purple robe, and a whip in the eggs.

Language Skills

Full group phonics: blends! In a blend, each letter retains its individual sound. We will make a start with initial s, l, r 2-letter blends, and final blends.

Reading & Writing: Friday afternoon we began writing our own version of the Three Littles and there were some very motivated writers! We continue writing fractured versions of this classic tale and find the winner of our book battle.

Spelling - I'm sorry I forgot to administer the spelling test on Fri-yay. We took care of it today. Here are the new lists for Thursday April 14 (note date change) Orange: blank, bleed, chart, chief, shore, shout, whine, where Blue: dock, lock, buck, duck, neck, deck, tack, sack Green: mad, nap, wet, web, did, rip, hut, bus

In **Creation Studies**, Air and Water in God's Environment. We can't see air, but God created it all around us. Air takes up space. How might we know that it is taking space? Then we will discuss how God gave us air and water to make certain activities possible.

In **Grade 1 Math**, some students will benefit from reviewing number words to twenty; that can be done using the first completed Jump math coming home today (not to be returned to school). Students were excited to begin a new unit in our second Jump math book! Our goal this week was to skip count by 5s; starting at different points at the hundreds chart takes the task from rote counting to understanding the patterns and what is actually being counted (groups of 5). Please remember that every **Tuesday** is our **library** day.

Grade 2 Math- Ms. ten Brink

We are so close to completing our math book! We have measured so many things around the classroom as we become more familiar with centimeters and meters. We will finish the unit off looking at mass and comparing different objects.

Math - We have finished our unit on time, and the test that was supposed to happen last week has been moved to TUESDAY. Students will need too now how to tell time (reading an analog clock, writing time in words), how to convert between lengths of time (hours, days, weeks), and how to find elapsed time using a number line.

Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Siebenga

Hiya folks,

As April begins I hope that the hope that accompanies this month, nourishes each moment.

It was a "fool of a day" on Friday. April 1st is certainly no joke. From students who skipped class, to mulch in my shoes, I will certainly be more prepared for the next one! Chalk one up for the common prankster on this day. Now, we look ahead... to no more snow days!

This week in the classroom:

In **Bible**, the students were successful in their endeavours with the last Unit's test or Brochure, depending on their choice. It was great to see some students try a digital design platform to create their brochures - Canva. These digital skills are relevant and applicable. For those that choose a more traditional path, the tests were completed well and, at the very least, showed their understanding of the Holy Spirit leading the gospel to the ears of the diverse church. Now we pivot to Easter and the resurrection of our Christ!

In **Math**, we are exploring fractions, percentages, and ratios. Through manipulatives, practice, and games the students will push their understanding of these concepts to better equip themselves and their number relationships. I will continue to assign tasks through Khan academy and look for steady practice with basic facts on Fridays.

In **Reading**, we have begun our next novel relating to our next social studies unit on Our Neighbours to the South, the United States of America. The "Underground to Canada," should produce a great lens to begin to explore this country's past, the connection Canada has with these events, and an exploration of family, trust, and the evil that existed often unbeknownst to those involved. We are revisiting the Literature Circle for this novel. Ask your student to explain what this is, and how this enables them to try on different hats as they explore literary techniques, new vocabulary, and to lead their group mates through discussion.

The Passion Projects / speeches have wrapped up just in the knick of time. With this, I mean to say that it was time to close them off, be happy with the results, and the efforts exerted. We now look forward to exploring a new way in which to express ourselves through our written word. In writing, we will move on to a more compact written expression - Microfiction. Like the name suggests, we will spend some time looking at writing short, yet powerful stories that work to challenge the students with word choice, and being concise.

In **Social Studies**, last week time was not on our side, as a great chunk of it was spent at home. This week, we will jump into our exploration of our Southern neighbours, the United States of America. Here are some enduring questions that you can ask your students, and that will drive our inquiries. What challenges does the United States face? How is the US living within the global community? How can Christians in Canada understand, support, and celebrate the United States? I hope that together we can observe how America is a continent and better understand what it means to be neighbours to these United States, and that God will help us explore areas that will enable us to better understand and serve Him through our neighbours.

Spelling continues with new lists posted on Google classroom weekly, in their newly created groups, and levels.

Gr. 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen:

Last week we 'lost' our classes. So, our lessons have been deferred

This week, D.V., we will continue to learn about levers, looking at input and output forces and work and target completion of mathematical lever-based problems together as well as those assigned for submission and assessment. Students are reminded of the need to [neatly] show their work, use proper units, and to make concluding statements in response to the original question posed.

Grade 7/8 Math - Mr. Boelens

This week we continue with integers. Daily assignments are given.

Grade 7 and 8 - Mrs. Vogel

Our theme this past week and this week is perspective. There are so many places where point of view and perspective make a difference in understanding a situation or why a group of people act the way they do.

Bible - We are nearing the end of our Bible unit on Proverbs looking at relationships and family. We have noticed that different families and different groups of society look at relationships in different ways, employing different perspectives.

Geography - This week we will be finishing our detailed study of perspective and how different people groups would look at the use of different natural resources found in Canada.

Guided Reading - We are looking at perspective in "The Hobbit" as well and trying to see conflict from the point of view of the different groups of characters we are encountering. We are finishing chapters 6 and 7 this week.

W.W.W. - Unit 5 work and unit test due on Friday, April 8.

Writing - It is National Poetry Month and, with that, we are starting a unit on poetry this week. We will be looking at what makes poetry poetry, reading and listening to a number of poems, and writing our own poems.

Art - We are going to be looking at perspective in art looking at both 1 and 2 point perspective drawings.

French - We are going to be continuing to look at hockey and the finer details of the sport with specific penalties and how they affect the game.
