Luke 24:1-7; On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again."

We have all just come out of a long winter here in Canada. This winter was good in the sense of an old fashioned winter with snow and freezing weather. These are things that some of us like, if you like hockey and skiing and making a snowman. This winter also seemed somewhat dark for us as we went through more of the COVID stuff, and believe me it seemed to get pretty long and dreary, but now finally there seems to be light at the end of the tunnel. We now do not need to wear masks anymore; yay!

Easter is also now upon us, as well as Good Friday; the believers in Christ had just witnessed the horrific crucifixion of our Saviour on the cross of Calvary. There He took our sin upon Himself and faced the punishment that we deserved for our sin. Isaiah 53:6 says **"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all."** It was for our sin that He was there on that cross. Jesus explains that several times in Luke 24, but I won't go into that at this time.

Now the women who believed and looked for the body of the LORD Jesus were told by angels that "He is not here, but has risen!" That is the best news ever! We serve a risen Saviour, He's in the world today, I know that He is living whatever men may say! 1 John 2:2 says "He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world." This tells me that the sacrifice of Christ on the cross is effective for anyone who believes. All the sins that were ever committed and will be committed, can be washed away by the blood of Jesus. The catch is that this is only effective when a person believes in Christ as their Saviour. The blood of Jesus is so precious that it was costly enough to pay for all and any sin, but again this only comes into effect to those who believe. That means we have the best news in all the world, for the whole world, to anyone who will believe. We need to share this Good news with those we meet, and rub shoulders with.

Finally we have a great future ahead of us! 1 John 3:1-2 "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like Him, for we shall see him as He is." Our sins are forgiven, past present and future. We still do confess our sins, as we still sin, and this maintains our sweet fellowship with God our Father. However when He appears, we will be changed in a moment, in the bat of an eye. Our mortal bodies will be changed into bodies like His risen glorified body. We will be like Him! So coming out of this nightmare of COVID, we can see the bigger picture of the great work that Our Great God and Saviour did in dying on the cross of Calvary, and then rising again. He defeated Satan, sin, death and hell, and He is now at God's right hand praying for each and every one of us. That is the best news we can ever think about, and the best is yet to come!




The girls and boys basketball teams played hard in their tournament. The reward...ice cream!


























A team event outside enjoyed by everyone on a nice sunny day, classroom activities and a Battle of the Books tournament: LCS seniors vs LCS juniors.






