From the Classrooms

<u>Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

Tuesday is Yellow Day! Students can wear something yellow or think of something that is yellow that they can tell us about.

This week we will review letters P-T using matching activities and the Jolly Phonics songs.

In our **workbooks** we will print letter M and review the frog jump letters (F,E,D,P,B,R,N,M), and we will also print letters H and K.

In Bible, we will read and learn about Paul.

In math, we will review numbers 0-10 by making a counting book.

Our health lesson this week will be about safety in the street.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we are going to focus on the long vowel Uu. We will sort pictures between short and long vowel sounds. We will be manipulating words by taking away beginning and ending sounds. We will be reviewing sight words and practice printing the lowercase letters.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will focus on the structure of a sentence, being aware of spaces between words and using punctuation.

In math, we count by 2s and 10s and will be introduced to subtraction by using songs and stories.

In **Bible**, we will wrap up the unit about Jesus' Ministry with the stories about Jesus and the Samaritan Woman and Jesus visits Mary and Martha.

Grade 1 and 2 - Mrs. Dykstra

- 1.In **Bible** class, we continue to learn about Jesus' parables. We discussed that parables are simple stories with a heavenly meaning. We are creating a large poster with pop-up art to teach others the "story time with Jesus" and how we can understand the parables.
- 2. Creation Studies has us studying animals; our scientists will build knowledge on animal classifications as well as study the specific classification of insects this week.
- 3. In **Grade 1 Math**, we completed another unit last week on number lines and subtraction. This brings us to a unit focusing on more complex addition and subtraction equations. The goal is to be efficient and accurate when solving our basic facts!

Language Skills

Full group phonics: vowel teams continue. We have worked on the long vowel sounds of "e" and "a", and hope to cover the remainder this week. Students seem to enjoy hunting for words that fit our lessons in any and all books/magazines/posters in our classroom.

Reading & Writing: What a delight to observe our class "pets." The larva are moving into the pupa stage! We are learning what entomologists do as well as the process of journaling about what we observe in our butterfly habitat.

Daily Read Aloud - We completed the first two books in the Flat Stanley series. Many students have reached for a Flat Stanley book from the classroom library since then! We are now finishing up a novel Mostly Monty, which is proving to be another class favorite.

Grade 5 and 6 - Mr. Siebenga

This week in the classroom:

In **Bible**, troubles happen, but we can learn through the events of Paul. Even when wrongfully arrested, he kept the faith.

In math, the students will be creating survey questions, relating to their class, and creating pie graphs. They will present their findings, and share them with the class.

In reading we will be reading chapters 15 / 16 this week.

Grade 5 and 6 French- Ms. VanKampen:

This week each student will be assessed on his/her reading [aloud] of [portions of] one of the recently 'studied' short stories; assessment will include fluency, pronunciation, and expression. While this occurs, students 'waiting' can make use of the time to yet read through their story and/or tackle a few vocabulary worksheets. Ideally, we will have the opportunity to begin a new unit based upon the verb aller (=to go).

Gr. 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen:

Last week we dealt with fluid flow; students were given questions and a task to complete at home which are due today. Today and Wednesday, we will focus on viscosity: comparing that of different fluids, the factors that influence this fluid property, and the resulting movement of those fluids. Lord willing, we can complete some hands-on activities too. Homework will include answering assigned questions – these deal with Understanding Concepts, Making Connections, Exploring, and Reflecting – some of which require students to complete some research, and undertake some extended thinking, as to how this fluid property relates to real life scenarios. **Students are reminded to read all assigned questions carefully to ensure that they answer what has been asked and to do so thoroughly.
