As our school and school community return to how we knew it before, I regain my appreciation for Christian schools – where we work in unity for a common goal of "Educating children, while nurturing faith in Christ, to interpret and impact God's world (LCS Purpose Statement).

### Upcoming Pizza Days


Wednesday May 4th & Wednesday May 18th

It is good to check in to see how the students are applying what they are learning in the classroom, and to wrap some things up before an exciting week. Either way, the students did well, and showed what they knew. There will be a few things to sign and return this week. I hope you all can experience the community connection that LCS provides this week. As little or much as you yourself is a part of it, know that I am honoured and grateful to be able to share Christian Education with your students. May God bless this week, and all the things that are in store.

This week in the classroom: In **Bible**, a new unit will be started. We will go back to Paul's Missionary journeys, and revisit Jesus's resurrection later. Praise Him that we can explore these early journeys in such a way.

In **math**, we have exhausted our exploration of the partial whole. At the very least, students bit off what they could chew, and applied the presented concepts in their practice, and can be happy with their results. Now we move on to data, graphs, organizing data in sheets / spreadsheets, creating charts, and linking other disciplines into surveys, handling their results, and expressing their findings.

In **reading** this week we will work with creating storyboards. An online resource, storyboardthat.com, will help kids create scenes from the story to depict different themes. The three themes we will discuss are perseverance, cruelty and bravery.

In social studies, the mini American culture projects and the infographics were done well. The students showed great tack in their navigation of Canva, and used their creative talent to show their understanding. Great job! We will now explore climographs and the state capitals. While looking at the location of the US states in relation to latitude, longitude and altitude. All these characteristics create some very interesting weather. From forest fires, floods, tornados, and drought, to bumper crops, pleasant evenings, and May flowers; the climate, geographic location, and terrain design provides our southern neighbours such a bounty of blessings. **Spelling** continues with new lists posted on Google classroom.
