In **Bible**, we will wrap up revelation this week. The students have done well to tackle this challenging book. In **math**, a unit problem to end the year off on probability for Grade 5. Exploration of the algebraic equation for the 6's. Khan academy activities, videos, and extra practice have been assigned.

In writing, we have created a Poetry Playoff and it is now in its third round. Thank you for the support having the students bring in poetry! From these introductions and our continued attempts, stumbles, and successes, the students will continue working with Haiku, Diamante, Sonnets, free verse, and Kenning techniques and styles of poetry to unleash their creative expressions.

In social studies, our last unit in science will be on "Space."
