Next week Monday is October 31. Some of us recognize that day as Reformation Day and some will recognize the date as Halloween. There is a range of responses within our school community.

As a school, we believe that how a family chooses to recognize the day is your family's decision. Catch Up Payments

Thursday, the Government announced via email a program parents can access to support them with the costs of education, specifically as students catch up in a post-COVID environment. Below is the email. It is up to you to access the funds if you apply.

"Today, the Ontario government launched Catch Up Payments, offering families direct financial support to support their children as they catch up. This money can be used to help to offset costs, whether that be for educational supplies, additional tutoring supports or other items to help their children address learning needs resulting from the pandemic.

Families will receive financial support. Students (up to 18 years old) can receive \$200 per child, while students with special education needs (up to 21 years old) can receive \$250. Families can apply for Catch Up Payments through a secure website where they can create a unique profile for each eligible student and check the status of their application throughout the process. Applications for Catch Up Payments are now open and will remain open until March 31, 2023."

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida This week is a very short week! On Monday, I will be away for the day and Mrs.

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

It might be a short week, but we will try to pack it full of learning and community building. We are well into our second book in the Secret of the Hidden Scrolls. It is a very quiet classroom during devotions as the book draws us all in deeply.

Bible: We continue with our stories of Abraham, and will discover that Abraham obeyed God even when it was hard. Abraham also asked God for the things he wanted, and God answered him.

In Math, we explore number sense to 20, as well as learn about ordinal numbers.

Language Arts Lessons

Word Detectives: Will our final mission arrive? Will we earn our badges? We are excited to read more and more sounds in words we don't yet know.

Phonics focus: mixed short vowel practice as a review. Ask your child to tell you the short sound of each vowel in the alphabet! These sounds should be fluent and quick.

Word study: as, be, said, you, and, are. These are all heart words we need to know.

Spelling words for dictation this Wednesday: (short vowel cvc words)

red, set, get, pig, zip, sit, not, pot, mom, mop, sun, cup. I will give a bonus challenge word and if students get their regular words plus the bonus correct, it is a Level E!

Chapter book read aloud: We will enjoy several picture books this week as mentor texts for our writing lessons. They will all focus on having a good growth mindset.

Handwriting: We will learn how to make words plural by adding s.

Creation Studies: Our cumulative activity for our mapping skills unit should be a great celebration of learning. We are creating a Grade One Town that will take up a big section of our room this week. Each student will fashion a paper bag house with a yard, as well as a business made out of sturdy tubes (thanks to Mr. Vandergaast for saving all of the toilet paper rolls for us). Then we will add roads, a river, a pond, as well as all elements of a map we have studied (a title, a legend, compass rose). On Wednesday, we will have a chance to play in the town in small groups. Students may bring a small toy car and/or small farm equipment toy, to enhance their creative play. I will have extras available for those who may wish to borrow one.

Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

Math skills: This week we will be reviewing Unit 1 of our math. We will also practice writing and matching numbers 1 to 20 as well as continue working on solving word problems.

Language skills

Handwriting: This week we write "Centre Starting Capitals": C, O, Q & G.

Writing: This week we work on our writing folders. We will be reviewing the writing process and start doing some narrative writing.

Spelling: In this week's spelling we review all the spelling words we have done this term.

Phonics: This week we work some more on initial blends and start looking at syllables.

Reading: In reading this week we are reading and discussing the book "The Girl Who Never Made Mistakes: A Growth Mindset Book" by Mark Pett and Gary Rubinstein. We will be discussing that it is okay to make mistakes, that everybody makes mistakes sometimes, and that we learn from them.

- <u>Grade 4 and 5</u> Students have made great progress learning/reviewing the days of the week, months of the year, and seasons. Activities will continue to use that information and the plan, ideally for this week, is to assess each student on these concepts. We also strive to consistently use French for even more simpler responses: Merci. (thank you), Pardon (English same but different pronunciation), Madame, Oui, Non, etc.
- <u>Grade 6</u> has been challenged with group dialogues [pre-written] which had to be put in order. Roles had to be assigned and lines learned. This week, each pair/trio/group will present on mercredi (Wednesday). Assessment will be based upon expression, pronunciation, fluency, etc. Students are encouraged to employ props, costumes, etc. as suits the dialogue and situation.

Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

Hello,

As you put your perennials to bed this weekend, or reaped what you sowed, I hope you were struck by the awe and wonder of His mighty works.

The book of Daniel is full of tremendous stories about faith, grit, and portrayals of His almighty abilities. This book will direct our class led assembly next week Tuesday, November 1. Make sure to attend if you are able. It should be a great time! Within class, we will learn more about how Daniel leaned in on the Lord in times of incredible adversity.

This week and into the long weekend, Grade 5 students will be responsible to finish Unit 2 in their workbook. That is Number Sense (NS), Grade 5 (5), and Lesson 13 for Grade 5. In the book it will read like this: NS5-13. For Grade 6, they will be working into Unit 3. For both grades, I will be introducing the concepts and ideas prior to the weekend, and putting up some slides to support them, in the cloud.

In Science, we will inspect the final two kingdoms of classification - Protists and Monera. These are microscopic organisms often found within Wetlands. The protection of these are vital to healthy habitats and our farming communities. The students will be introduced to Jane Goodall and the work that she has done with primates to better understand these creatures. The acronym APE will be used to guide students on their next presentation. It stands for Animals, People and the Environment. Check out rootsandshoots.org to learn more.

The students will be assigned a few chapters to read over the weekend of Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe. They will be assigned a couple of quizzes that will be sent out on the Google classroom.
