Junior Kindergarten- Mrs. Baarda

As November begins, JK will start a new theme on transportation. This week we will be doing a sort to decide which vehicles travel by land, by air, and by water. For our art project we will be using shapes to make a vehicle.

Our focus letter this week is letter Ee. We will be learning to recognize upper and lowercase E and learning the sound letter E makes by doing some fun activities. In math, we will be counting down from 10 and beginning to print numbers 1-5. In Bible, we will read about Joseph and his coat and what happened to him when he was in Egypt. We will also begin a new unit and learn about Miriam and baby Moses. In health, we will look at two more feelings: afraid and sad.

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

I hope that you all had a great few days off. This week we will continue to focus on the letter Cc, rhyming words, and listening activities. Students will be introduced to Pete the Cat and his coloured shoes and we will focus on the sequence of how Pete's shoes changed from one colour to another.

In math, we will explore using the concept of more, less, and the same using shapes. In Bible, we will learn about Jacob and Esau and the conflict of the birthright. November calendars have been sent electronically and if you have requested a paper copy, it will be in your envelope.

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

Welcome back to a full week of learning. It was an inspiring teachers' convention; I was reminded again why I chose to teach in Christian education. I valued both the learning and connections with staff. I hope you enjoyed the days with your family. Bible: New memory words are the words of God to Abram in Genesis 12:2. This is God's covenant (a super promise from God): "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing." We continue studying the promises of God made to Abraham.

In math, students will determine how many more and how many fewer by pairing objects up and counting the extras. Students will also understand how much more or fewer one number is than another.

Language Arts - Phonics focus: words, books, games to practice our learnings on the short vowels. We will read in small groups rotating with Mrs. Dykstra to practice using all the skills. Our lessons on blends begin next week (2 letters together that make 2 sounds). We also practice our phonemic awareness daily. While phonics is visual, phonemic awareness is auditory. Both are effective tools for helping children understand the symbols and sounds that create our alphabet and the words those letters build.

Spelling words for dictation on Friday, November 11: (l-blends) flag, slim, plan, sled, slam, plum, flop, flat, club, glad, plug,

Chapter book read aloud: We begin a new series - Mercy Watson. This hilarious series introduces a new hero for early chapter book readers. Mercy isn't just a pig, she's a porcine (por-seen) wonder! Our writing tasks, comprehension, and vocabulary activities all connect with these books.

Handwriting: We are on high alert for letter and number reversals! Can we spot our own mistakes and turn our letters and numbers the correct direction without reminders from Officer Dykstra? We will also continue learning to form lowercase letters.

Creation Studies: Show what you know about our mapping unit along with a few more play sessions in our Grade One

Health: God gives us good food; our mini-unit allows us to ask questions about food proportions, hunger, thirst, and Canada's Food Guide.

Math skills: This week we will be focusing on ordinal numbers.

Handwriting: This week we review writing capitals and numbers. Writing: We continue to work on our writing folders and finish our sequential writing pieces this week. Spelling: Our spelling words for the week: add, ask, came, name, ride, bone, save, kite, cute, mine. Please remember to practice your sight words at home and let me know how you are doing. Phonics: This week we continue working with some more initial blends and syllables.

Reading: In reading this week, we are reading and discussing the book "Preston's Positive Thoughts by Jenelle French". We will be discussing why positive thoughts are important and how it affects us. I will also continue doing running records with the children in my class.

After a great few days of teacher's convening, it's time to implement what was gleaned. Phew, let's get to work!

The assembly is on Tuesday, and the students have put together a great skit showing the strength, and tremendous faith and truth of Daniel. Make sure to attend if you can, it should be fun! The students will be creating a booklet of their new understandings from the book of Daniel and sharing a unique point of view from one of the bystanders to such incredible Biblical events.

There were a number of pages assigned over the weekend from their JUMP maths work books. This was for them to practise time management, and autonomy, while also pushing them with their maths work. Grade 5 will move forward with Number Sense and Grade 6 with Data management. Tests for these units will be upcoming.
