This week we will focus on the letter and sound of Dd. The following children are asked to bring in show and tell beginning with letter D.

In **language arts**, we will be working on our listening skills as we play musical chairs and the whisper game. We will be matching rhyming words and clapping how many words in a sentence. In our journals, we are labeling the items that we draw.

In **math**, we will be looking at the concept less than and the number zero. Students are counting to 20 and working on recognizing numbers to 10.

For printing, we are working on straight line letters L, V and W.

In **Bible**, we are learning about Joseph as a slave in Potiphar's house. Our memory work is Romans 8:28. We will learn this together at school.

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

It was good to gather and remember on Friday. We also took time to reflect on peace and our freedom living in Canada. It is **Stone Soup** week in Grade One! We will learn about what a folktale is and read several versions of Stone Soup. It is a story of kindness and sharing. All of our writing and reading activities will be focused on a version of this classic story. This means...we get to eat together! We will have a **class lunch** on **Thursday**! We will enjoy making and eating stone soup together for our class lunch. Please send the usual snacks for your child but we will make soup in the morning and eat some at lunch, served with crackers. Yum, yum! If you think your child might not eat a lot of our soup lunch, please send a regular sandwich. You **do not** need to provide anything for the soup; it is my pleasure to bring the ingredients and make it with students.

Bible: We have a new unit Isaac and Jacob. While Jacob's choices were often unwise and harmed others; God would use Jacob to fulfill his promises to Abraham and Isaac. In **math**, we continue to work on number sense to 20.

Language Arts - Phonics focus: We continue our study of l blends, s blends, and r blends. In a blend, each letter retains its individual sound. Our book time allows us to search for words that have a blend in them.

Word study: two, what. Spelling words for Friday, November 25 are based on s-blends. snap, snip, snug, slug, stub, stir, step, stop, stem, star, skip, scar. Spelling rules: we will talk about when to use a c or k in our spelling.

Chapter book read aloud: We finish our enjoyment of Mercy Watson chapter books with one last read. We then read versions of Stone Soup for the remainder of the week.

Handwriting: We are working our way on our lowercase letter formations.

Creation Studies: We continue on with spotting the seasonal autumn (oh the irony with the snow!) changes in animals, people, plants, and the weather that God has in store for us to see and experience.

Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

Math skills: This week we finish our work on repeating patterns.

Handwriting: We practice writing lowercase letters that look like their capitals and t - c, o, s, v, w, t.

Writing: We start working on informative writing.

Spelling & phonics: This week we work on the revision of spelling and phonics we have done so far.

Reading: In reading this week, we are reading and discussing the book "Zach Gets Frustrated" by William Mulcahy. This book offers a healthy mindset learning opportunity with techniques to practice and to remember when dealing with frustration. We are also using different reading strategies to work on explicit and systematic decodable passages in our class.

Library: Tuesdays is our library day! Please remind your children to pack their library books in their backpacks tonight.

Grade 2- Mrs. Koersen

We only have one day together this week. In **Bible**, we will be learning about the 7 days of creation. In **Creation studies**, we will be looking at what happens when we don't fill our roles and responsibilities in our families and communities. We are not quite ready for a French play yet, so we will continue with basics such as colours, numbers, greetings and items around our classroom. In gym we will wrap up different skills used in basketball. Look for things being sent home in kidmail like book orders, memory work, and completed work.

Grade 3- Mrs. Claus

Well, it has finally arrived after such a beautiful November. Snow in grade 3 is known as "sky barf". I am not a fan of the white stuff. But, alas, I live in Canada where it abounds and the kids sure do have a lot of fun in it!

Bible- Memory work was done very well last week! We are finishing up our unit this week with a test coming next week.

Math- We are currently learning about regrouping with tens blocks. We will soon we adding and subtracting with regrouping. Practicing simple math addition and subtraction at home would be helpful!

Language- Last week I did assessments on reading sounds, words, a passage, and filling in the blanks. Most of the students did well. Some are still working on learning the sounds that goes with the letter or letter combinations. Some are still progressing towards comprehension. While others are still working towards reading words. Any extra practice at home would be helpful.

Some changes to the plans had to be made last week as the powtoon just didn't fit as well as another discipline. I hope the students were able to find a few moments on the weekend to look over their notes for the Bible test this morning! They did well. ;)

Math tests will be happening on Thursday for both Grade 5 and 6. Both on Number sense, and showing what they know regarding strategies to use for multi digit addition and subtraction, and the manipulation of integers, through rounding, equating value, and real world applications.

The students will write a test on the **novel** *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* on Tuesday of this week. We will watch the movie on Wednesday and Thursday.

The students are working to design a proposal from their group's perspective. These will be presented to an acting owner of the property; awarding the group the property with the most compelling proposal / powtoon digital story. The decision will be gauged on how the group takes into consideration our second line of scientific inquiry: *How can we care for and nurture the biodiversity of creation*. Happy creating / learning. In **PSPE** the students have been assigned an online unit on Social Emotional Learning.
