Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

Stone Soup week was so much fun. Everyone tried some soup and many enjoyed it. This week our writing will focus on this folktale.

Bible: New memory words for in-class practice is Genesis 28:15 "I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go, and I will bring you back to this land." Students are very engaged in our Bible stories on Jacob.

In math, we got a bit behind last week so we will now use tens and ones blocks on a hundreds chart to show a number, compare and order numbers to 20, count on from any number within 20, and look at ordinal numbers. That should have us ready to show what we know either Friday or Monday next week.

Language Arts - Phonics focus: we wrap up our study of blends this week. Students are encouraged to practice the "tr" and "dr" blends. These were the most difficult for many students to say and write.

Word study: who, want

Spelling words for this Friday, November 25 are based on s-blends. snap, snip, snug, slug, stub, stir, step, stop, stem, star, skip, scar. Spelling rules: we continue to practice when to use a c or k in our spelling. There are two opportunities to practice this in our spelling dictation this week (skip and scar).

Chapter book read aloud: Our new read aloud is the classic series The Littles by John Pederson. It will be fun to do a bit of writing on this series over the next few weeks.

Handwriting: When we write ANYTHING, we form our letters the correct way. We will do some focused work on reversals and how we can spot them in our writing.

Creation Studies: I will introduce our next Social Studies unit this week which is Christmas Around the World! It is a wonderful opportunity to look at the world through a Christian perspective, using a cultural study of how other cultures celebrate the season of Christ's birth.

Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

Math skills: This week we start working on length. Handwriting: We practice writing the letters "a' and "d".

Writing: We are working on informative writing this week. Spelling & phonics: This week we work some more on closed syllables. Starting next week, we will start writing spelling tests on Mondays to give them some extra time to practice reading and writing their spelling words for the week. Our spelling words for this week (and the test on Monday 28th) is: bottom, carrot, fabric, insect, magnet, ribbon, lesson and puppet.

Reading: In reading this week we are reading and discussing the book "The Juice Box Bully" by Bob Sornson and Maria Dismondy. This book is about a new kid in school that is quite the bully. When he sees how this school stands up for each other, and even refuses to be mean to him in return, he realizes his mistakes and wants to join their kind community. We are using different reading strategies to work on explicit and systematic decodable passages in our class. We are also reading on Epic to help us with our informative writing this week.

Library: Tuesdays is our library day! Please remind your children to pack their library books in their backpacks tonight.

Grade 4 and 5 - Mrs. Delleman

Memory Work - Judges 21:25 - due NEXT Thursday - "In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as they saw fit."

Spelling - We will be taking a short break from spelling lists over the next two weeks and will instead be reviewing letter and vowel sounds as a whole class.

Math - We have finished a unit on measurement, time, and mass/temperature and will have our quiz on FRIDAY. Students will take home duotangs and Smartboard notes will be sent home to study for the quiz.

I Know It - Since we have a Math quiz this week, students do not have an I Know It assignment due. However, in preparation for our next unit, students are encouraged to start practicing and memorizing their multiplication facts!

Grade 4/5 and 6 French- Ms. VanKampen:

We have been focusing on the definite and indefinite articles -- quite challenging for some while others seem to be grasping this topic with ease. While this material is foundational to French and will continue to be part and parcel to what we continue to do, an assessment will be given this week. The bulk of Grade 6 will be given an independent task using the French-English dictionary.

Grade 4 and 5 will be also learning about weather descriptors.

Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

Hello, and just like that, we are in the middle of winter! Enjoy the beauty of the season!

Our next unit in **Bible** has begun with us looking at Ester. This is a nice change from looking at Daniel, as now we get a woman protagonist. From the Feasts of King Xerxes, to Haman and the lots casts, to the Plea's of Ester to save her people, Ester has a lot of terrific detail. The students will be promoted to search for ways in which we can be directed by God, to not be dismayed, but to celebrate after times of trouble and anguish.

In math, new groups will be used to get us back on track within our units. JUMP maths is new for me, and after some PD with some fellow teachers, and some new plans as to another way in orchestrating this new curriculum, we should be all set. Or at least until we have to rejig things again. :) Some unit ending tests will be happening later in the week. These will be set on number sense, and showing what they know regarding strategies to use for multi digit addition and subtraction, and the manipulation of integers, through rounding, equating value, and real world applications.

The students did a great job on their powtoon digital proposal from their group's perspective for what to do with "The Hannah Property." These rubrics and QR codes will come home this week. Make sure to check out what your student has been creating.

Our next **social studies** unit will be on Culture. Some essential questions that will steer the unit will be: What is culture? How can we create positive culture in our homes, classrooms, and communities? And, Are we culture makers?

A major component to expressing one's culture is exemplified with our holidays and traditions. An upcoming holiday plays a significant role in our Judeo-Christian cultural traditions - Christmas. Students will be selecting a country of the world, and exploring how this country celebrates this holiday. Similarities, and differences; uniqueness and peculiarities; students will be able to explore a number of aspects to this tradition that they may know, or others that they can explore. A secret santa is coming too, as well as a Classroom Cultural Christmas Market to end off the unit. Let the holidays begin! In this spirit, make sure to come out for this weekend's LCS Bazaar!

In writing, we will be looking at sources and research. What are primary sources, secondary sources, and how we can use these to learn about other people's cultures? The students will be conducting interviews from hopefully primary sources, or at least finding secondary sources written about the Christmas holidays of their chosen country!

We will begin our new Novel "From Anne". The students will be responsible for **reading** the first two chapters of this book this week and working on comprehension questions in their Silent Time. Grade 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen

Last week we began our second unit: <u>Heat in the Environment</u>. Using TVO Learn resources as an introduction, we examined the difference between heat and temperature and were introduced to the concepts of conduction, convection, and radiation; a short video has yet to be viewed on the UN Sustainable Development Goals which provides a look into global connections. We will then proceed to **Thermal Energy**, **Particle Theory**, and **Heat Transfer**.

Grade 7/8- Mrs. Vogel

Bible - Students wrote their Bible test last week and will have it returned this week. We will start on our second unit today which will focus more on the expansion of the early Church.

History - Students finished their work on Ancient Rome with an essay written in class on why Ancient Rome fell. They will also receive this back this week and we will be starting our first geography unit of the year this week.

Geography - As our first history unit has been completed, we will now be starting geography. We will start with a review of mapping and a look at where Canada is in the world.

Art - The students overall did a great job on their Remembrance Day posters. They showed thought and effort went into their projects and should be proud of their work. They also completed the first stage of their sketchbooks this past week which were also done extremely well. We have some very talented artists in grade 7/8! We will move on to other art projects this week.

Guided Reading - We have looked at a lot of the background to the stories and learned a lot of the vocabulary we are going to need to fully understand the stories. We will start the first few chapters this week.

W.W.W. - We will have our unit 4 test on Tuesday, November 22. We will also be introduced to and work with our unit 5 work this week. Test and assignments on November 29.

French - Students are continuing to work with the different ways to describe themselves, how to properly conjugate the verbs for "I" and what to do when there are two verbs in a row.

Healthy Living - Students we will be hopefully finishing the round robin part of our volleyball tournament this week and playing our final games next week.
