You prepare A TABLE

We are in a season now when, as a society whether Christian or not, families and friends come together to feast, break bread, or share a meal together. Thanksgiving of course just passed in October and now we look forward to Christmas. So, as I was thinking about what I might want to share with you through this piece, this theme kept coming to me; Feast.

In my time of research and writing to prepare, I learned a few things. God values feasts. In Exodus 5:1 it says Afterward Moses and Aaron went in and told Pharaoh, "Thus says the Lord God of Isreal: Let my people go, that they may hold a feast to Me in the wilderness." This is the first thing that God had Moses say to Pharaoh, so it must hold high value to God. As I researched further, I learned that there are 7 feasts that God had given to the Israelites as a way for them to honour and worship Him. These are still observed in the Jewish communities today. A few of you may recognize, Rosh HaShanah, meaning "head of the year". This is the Day of Repentance when the Israelites take a look at their spiritual condition and repent to ensure that the upcoming year is pleasing to God. Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement, is a day where Israelites offer a blood sacrifice to cover their sins. Now the jewish people offer a day of fasting and prayer asking God for forgiveness. The Passover feast, of course, is observed as a reminder of the night when the Israelites sacrificed the lamb and applied the blood onto their doorposts for the angel of death to passover. This is also the feast that Jesus and his disciples were honouring, at the Last Supper, which again shows us that God values feasts, since Jesus himself honoured this feast.

One feast in particular kept coming to mind. It's not one that can be found on the calendar, or that we can find a picture of from when we sat at this particular table, but it is one that we all know about or at least have heard of.

Psalm 23 (NLT) The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. He lets me rest in green meadows; He leads me beside peaceful streams. He renews my strength. He guides me along right paths, Bringing honour to his name. Even when I walk through the darkest valley, I will not be afraid, For you are close beside me. Your rod and your staff protect and comfort me. You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honour me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings. Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me All the days of my life, And I will live in the house of the LORD forever.

I love this Psalm, this promise from God. He gives me all that I need, He lets me rest in green pastures and beside peaceful streams, He protects me and renews my strength and surely His goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life. This is amazing! But look at that right in the middle. "You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies."Why? Sometimes, we will have to tolerate certain family members or certain people at our feasts, but I wouldn't call them enemies. God, you just took me to green meadows and peaceful streams, why not feast there? Why in the presence of my enemies? Seems odd to me. If anyone reading this has answers to these questions I would love to have that conversation with you. In the mean time, I have found some thoughts that I would like to share. 
We began our school year with a lot of "newness". Twenty to twenty-five percent of our school community was new this year. First of all, acknowledge that some of our students and families graduated and some staff left for other schools, but this year we recovered our school size and added students, families, and staff. Thirty-six of the students in our hallways and classes are new to LCS this year. Fifteen of our families are new, and four of our staff are new. Overall, that is roughly twenty-three percent of our school community that is new. What a blessing to bring in new people who desire a Christian education. but it also takes longer for us to "get in the groove".


Our staff has grown, and we now have nineteen people holding a combination of part time and full time paid positions. As the staff increases so does the administrative aspect and we adjusted this year to create an administrative team approach. Mrs. Bierling is our student Support Services teacher, and she works with our staff to ensure that, as much as possible,

the academic needs of each student are being met. She creates a schedule for herself and our EAs and she oversees their work. Mrs. Delleman is our curriculum coordinator, and she works with our staff to ensure they have curriculum as well as investigates and proposes new materials to ensure we remain current in our resources. Mrs. Weishar is our Administrative Assistant and she works in the office and interacts with students, teachers and parents in many ways, mostly making sure everyone is going to the right places and communication is clear. Each of them bring their experience and passion to make LCS a great school, and I enjoy working with them.

Our annual Edvance conference this year focussed on what it means to be a part of a flourishing school. Not only do you have to have excellent staff, but you also have to support them. The same is true for students: if you want them to flourish, you have to support them. I have great confidence in the people we have in place to enable LCS to flourish. Together we are providing quality Christian education where we are "educating children, while nurturing faith in Christ, to interpret and impact God's world. We are getting into the groove.




Another one of the board's duties is to maintain and update our board and school policies. We have been reviewing and updating documents and policies at each meeting to ensure things are up to date and relevant.



One thought that Bill shared in this teaching that really made me look at myself is that so many believers can only see the enemies. They define their circumstances by the enemies they see instead of their position at the table in that the Lord has prepared for them. Yup, that's me. I've definitely been the one when in a difficult season who looks away from the One who is sitting right there with me, my Father, my Shepherd whose rod and staff protect me, and instead focus on my enemies or the bad situation that I am in at the time. Maybe you can't relate? I hope you can't, but for those who can relate, you are not alone. We are at the table with our Father, looking around at all of our enemies, feeling all kinds of emotions, fear, anger, doubt, anxiety.... but then we look across the table and lock eyes with Him. INTRODUCING THE Greidanus family



We are excited to watch our girls grow in their academic life and journey of faith.




























INTRODUCING THE Miller family
