We have a new theme for February, Love! We will be talking about how to show love to our families and friends and those in God's family. Our **art** activity for this week is marble painting a heart.

This week we will be reviewing short e sound and will be learning the sound of the letter Gg. Students are encouraged to point to sounds they know and see if they can read some words such as I, am, Sam, sat, mat, hat and cat. We are always rhyming words and clapping out the number of syllables per word. Challenge your child by asking them to give you the beginning sound of a word or name.

In **math**, we are working on identifying the numbers 8 and 9, counting to 50, and learning the sign for greater than.

In **Bible**, we will continue learning about the Israelites traveling in the desert to the promised land. We will see what the tabernacle looked like and why the Israelites thought it was important to have.

On Mondays, we will have gym and on Fridays for the next four weeks we will be learning about healthy eating.

Writing: Our family writing is coming along nicely. We will continue with that another week yet as it is a longer piece for students to produce.

Math: This week, we will start with daily math minutes for addition and subtraction. Students work at their own pace for 3 minutes of addition and subtraction questions. It is a little bit of a challenge and some time pressure; our goal in Grade One is to try new and harder things together. For our lessons, we continue to study strategies for adding (counting on, using a 5 or 10, using a chart).

Creation Studies: We have a few tasks remaining in our unit; changes in our families, respectful behaviour, and taking care of God's world. These assignments will create the bulk of our grades for creation studies, so I will encourage students to add details, label their pictures, and do more than expected.

French: follow up paperwork to our lessons on la famille.

Good morning everyone,

As we slide further into this winter season, I hope God's energy is with you, His rest be found for potential rejuvenation, and His truths stimulate you to power forward!

In the classroom:

In math, today the students wrote their mid unit quiz that was planned for last Friday on Geometry / Measurement. A unit ending culminating project is in the works for both grades to practically apply the concepts found within the unit. This will be assigned later this week.

In **Bible**, the Judhites have been exiled. Even with all the good kings, the warnings and reasons to repent, the prophets constantly telling them to repent and turn from their ways, God's people could not prevent His plan from being carried out. We will conclude the unit this week by looking at what was going on in the world at the same time as the exile of Judah and what God's kingdom looked like at the same period. A test is planned for Friday, with a review happening before. The review questions will be in the G. classroom to support all students.

In our **novel study**, this week the students are responsible for reading chapters 17/18. With only one week left of reading within the text, students are encouraged to complete the reading comprehension questions that we have been working through. To culminate this study, the students will be using the "Creative Literature" assignments found within the G. Classroom to present their learning and their new found knowledge and to apply the themes discussed throughout the novel in their presentations. These are scheduled for Monday, February 20, 2023. A digital google form test will also be given that same day. Ample class time will be given for the projects, however, some supplies and extra support may be required.

The second of the two energy experiments will be conducted today / this week - the solar water heater. From here the two grades will deviate a bit from one another. The Grade 5 will be exploring the energies of our planet and how we may continue to harness these to promote effective technologies. They will look at an inventioneering challenge in order to explore machines, how they work, and eventually collaborate in groups to complete some explorations. The Grade 6's will be looking into electricity. What it is, how it works, and some of the introductory components that we use to manipulate it in our lives.

The **Classroom Economy** was back in full form last week. The reflections that most students wrote from their perspective at the mid way point of this economy were received and will now be acted upon. Some students may lose their jobs. as they desired, or as need be. :(Others will continue to participate in their duties, while still others will look to start a new responsible chapter with some new job openings. Check in with your student to see how they are making out. Talk about real life applications! :)
