For the rest of the month of April we will be exploring the season of spring. We will plant some seeds so we can watch them sprout and see how they grow, and we will learn about what plants need to grow.

Our focus letter this week is letter V. We will learn the Jolly Phonics song for letter V and complete our letter find page, as well as do some hands-on activities to recognize letter v and its sound.

In Bible, we will learn about when Jesus appeared to some people after he rose from the dead and about when he ascended to heaven.

In math, we will practice counting to 20, and learn that there are different ways to make a number. In health, we will focus on our sense of taste.

Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida

This week we will be **reviewing letters** s, t, m, n, a ,d, i, p and c as well as reviewing the sight words the, see, I , a, like, and the connecting word AND. We will continue to listen for the number of sounds in a word and then attach letters to those sounds. For **Handwriting Without Tears**, we are learning lowercase diver letters. This means the letters dive down and swim up or go further down. Our first diver letter is lowercase p.We will continue practice printing on the line, between the lines, or below the line.

In **Bible**, we will hear the Resurrection story and how Jesus shows Himself to the disciples. Our memory work is John 3:16

In math, we will continue to build teen numbers to 20 and add numbers together using objects and number lines.

We are tracking April's weather. Last week we learned that the sun is very important to God's creation and to us as God made it to give us light. This week we will experience windy weather using a fan and a variety of objects to see if they blow in the wind.

Grade 5 and 6 and SK will host an assembly mid-May. The date will be determined soon. Please dress for the weather. Options are always welcomed. Layers are a good option.

Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

Welcome back! In **Bible** class, we continue the Easter unit by illustrating the greatest story ever told: the Resurrection of Jesus! We also reflect on Romans 5: 6 and 8. We had some guests arrive in our classroom this morning - ask your child! Reading: We will review all the long vowel sounds we have studied over the last number of weeks. We will also review our phonics skills of Lefty Larry, Grapheme Grasshopper and Blendy Wendy - you need all these skills to read!

Spelling: Show what you know is on Friday. The words are: toe, boat, coat, crow, flow, tow, grow, glue, blue, new, stew, chew.

Grammar: We will begin to layer in grammar studies until the end of the year. We will start with verbs - a verb is a word, it's an action word!

Reading and Writing: The rest of April (and perhaps into May) has us studying "how-to" writing. We will keep a tally of how many hilarious "how-do" books we read together. Teacher-directed modeling happens first, followed by shared writing, and brainstorming what each student might like to teach others "how-to" do. God has gifted each of us with something to teach and share to our classmates!

Math: We continue our number sense unit on skip counting. We will work on backwards counting skills; then we are on to use base ten blocks to represent numbers as well as find numbers on the hundreds chart.

Creation Studies: We will have 1-2 more building sessions. Then we will write some silly things about materials: what if your bike was made out of chocolate? Chapter book read aloud: Heartwood Hotel: The Greatest Gift

Math: This week, we are working on geometry. We look at symmetry, matching shapes, and creating shapes. Spelling & phonics: This week we are studying words with the phonic skill r-controlled vowels er, ir & ur. When these vowels are in the middle of a word, they typically represent the short vowel sound. However, when followed by r, the sound is changed. Writing: This week, we start with opinion writing.
