Word Detectives: are back in action. We received a new challenge from The Secret Detective Agency asking us to use the different types of syllables to help us read. We should use punctuation marks at the end of each sentence. We use tools around the classroom to spell new words, like our heart word wall and our writing office. I want to spend a few more days on activities first. Here are the words for Thursday: wool, foot, look, wood, good, cook, gloom, tool, cool, roof, mood, food Math: We are steadily working through our unit on addition and subtraction.

Grade 4/5 and 6 French- Ms. VanKampen:

Our focus on grammar topics will continue this week. The 'plan' is to cover the **preposition** "**de**" with its use to indicate possession (i.e. 'from') as well as the **possessive adjectives my** [mon/ma/mes], **yours** [ton/ta/tes], **his/hers** [son/sa/ses] for singular and plural nouns accordingly.

Grade 6 will also be completing a written assessment on the [singular & plural] masculine and feminine forms of adjectives as covered last week.

Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

I hope you all had a great Victoria day weekend, may your cup be filled.

In **Bible** we will wrap up this unit on Jesus' Early Ministry with a Jeopardy review this morning. The test will be on Thursday morning.

In math, Grade 6 continues with translations, reflections, and rotations of geometric shapes. Grade 5 on equivalent fractions, mixed numbers, and the parts of a fraction. Check in with your student to see how these these are coming, unit tests will be next week

We will finish our novel NEXT week. A movie comparison and unit test will be next week. An unabridged audio file for the book is in the classroom. Listen along with your student as need be. We will study the themes of compliance, the author's use of light, character development, and what it means to be a hero! Enjoy.

Our **media** endeavour is wrapping up. Students are working with creating storyboards for their commercials and Public Service Announcements. The rants are being written in their groups too. The Rant will make use of our Green Screen in our back room. The final copy of their storyboards are due in the classroom on Thursday. From here the students will self assess, peer assess, and complete their final copy.

In Physical, Social, and Emotional Education (PSPE), we will wrap up any needed track and field practice - triple jump, shot put and dashes. In **health**, we will be looking in depth at our human development and sexual health throughout the next few weeks.

Healthy Living: We will continue to practice for track and field this week. Next week we will focus on baseball. We are also working through our intensive health unit relating to sexual education and will have a test either on Thursday or Tuesday covering the materials covered during this unit.

Last week, we did our MAP testing and most students showed significant progress. Well done! We also participated and challenged ourselves with the Gauss Contest.
