# Junior Kindergarten- Mrs. Baarda

What a great day Thursday was! It was wonderful to meet and talk with grandparents when they visited the classroom. I am so proud of all of the JK students, you did a great job saying the poem for your parents and grandparents up on the stage! This Tuesday is orange day in JK! Students can wear something orange or bring in something orange to show the class. Our focus letter this week is Zz which means we have learned about the whole alphabet! We will learn our final Jolly Phonics song and do a couple of activities to practice our z knowledge. Then, next week, we will begin reviewing the letters we have learned.

In math, we will be printing 8, 9, and 10 and have simple introductions to adding and subtracting

In Bible, we will learn about the Greatest Commandment and Pentecost.

In health, we will learn about street safety and talk about good rules for when we are walking on the sidewalk or needing to cross the street.

#### Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida

This week, we will focus on making our Moms a special Mother's Day surprise. We have been chatting about Moms for the last week. You are all VERY LOVED! The students make it sound like they are helpful all the time. I hope that is true for at least the most part. HAPPY MOTHER'S DAY to all of you!

We will also be learning about caterpillars turning to butterflies and what the difference is between a butterfly and a moth.

This week, we will be isolating letter sounds and identifying them and printing the corresponding letter. We are really working on printing lowercase letters. Practice makes perfect.

In math, we will practice printing numbers 1 to 20, counting to 100, and learning about concrete and picture graphs.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will be printing lowercase f and printing words on a line.

In **Bible**, we continue to practice Joshua 24:15 together. Our lessons on Joshua wrap up this week with show what you know. **Grammar:** Next up is adjectives. How can adjectives add interest to our readers? **Writing:** Our moms will be on our hearts and minds this week as we write. Thank you Lord for moms!

Math: We are just getting started with a coin counting unit.

**Creation Studies:** We will learn about what makes a bird a bird this week. We were in wonder as the chicks hatched in our room! God, you make amazing things!

#### Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

I hope you enjoyed the musical and that all the grandparents had a lovely grandparent's day. The students were so excited to have them here and enjoyed making their little gifts. I am going to miss all the catchy tunes the students were singing throughout the day from "Not your Average Joe". Here is an outline of our work for this week:

**Math:** This week, we are finishing our work on word problems and start working on some number sense.

**Spelling & phonics:** This week, we are studying words with the phonic skill short oo. A variant vowel is a group of letters that represents the sound of a vowel. In our word study units, we are focusing on students learning an explicit phonics skill rather than memorizing a list of words.

**Popcorn words:** Please remember to practice reading the popcorn words every day and completing the sheet that needs to be returned. Thank you to those who sent the popcorn recording sheets back last week. If you haven't returned it yet, will you please send it back as soon as possible. I would like to send you a new sheet, but would also like to see how much your child has improved in reading sight words this past month and celebrate with them.

If I send you the next sheet and your child is able to read the words well, please practice writing them as well. A few of the students have practiced writing the words too, and it is making a big difference to their writing which in turn motivates them to write even more. If your child can read and write them, please send the sheet back and I will send you the next set of popcorn words. Please reach out to me if you have any questions.

Writing: This week, we are working on opinion writing.

**Reading:** In our decodable readers, we read a story focusing on the phonic skill short oo.

**Library:** We have library tomorrow. Please remind your child to pack his/her library books this evening.

# Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

Good day folks. Well, the leaves are out, and it appears so are the Leafs. Ohh well, as Cec would say, there's always next year! Here's what's up in the classroom:

In **Bible**, last week's Test will be returned this week. Our next few units will all be about Jesus. We will start with His early Ministry, including John the Baptist, Jesus' baptism, Satan tempting Jesus, Nicodemus, and the Living Water. On Thursday of this week we will be looking at Jesus' Baptism. The students have taken home a sheet that they should record some information about their own baptism. Please help them fill this out, and bring it back for Thursday.

In math, some more work has been returned. Please ask to see it and go over some of these items with them. There are a few Grade 6 students who are "right there" with regards to making the connection with double digit long division. Some extra practice at home would push them over the edge. Grade 5 continues on with fractions, and decimals, while Grade 6 is plotting points, tessellations and transformation within Geometry. Let's end strong! Remember one lesson a day. :)

Within our **novel**, we have moved on to Book the **Fourth**. An unabridged audio file for the book is in the classroom. This week, we will be reading chapters 41-43. Listen along with your student as need be. We will study the themes of compliance, the author's use of light, character development, and what it means to be a hero! Enjoy.

This week the reading strategy and writing skill are as follows:

Reading Strategy: Determine Importance

Writing Skill: Organizing your ideas

I will be checking in with students throughout the week on these, and collect them on Friday

As we continue on with our media endeavour, we will discuss ways in which we talk to one another, how people talk at us, and how we as Christians are called to make disciples of all nations. The campaign is beginning to take shape. We have now studied Advertisements, Rants, and Public Service Announcements. To direct the group's ideas, and expressionary outlets, we will explore the Sustainable Development Goals of the United Nations this week.
