### awaiting A PROMISE BY DIANNE NORRIS

Spring. I've heard it described in many different ways. I recently shared a creator's video on social media where it was humourously described as winter's hangover, a disappointment, and nature's broken promise. As I look around at the dirt covered snow piles filled with garbage, mud everywhere, and wake up to cool snowy mornings, I can't help but agree. Until I take a more thorough look around and realize that couldn't be further from the truth.

Spring is a season filled with promise. The buds on the trees promising new leaves. The birds' songs promising warmer weather. The flash of green in the daffodils fighting to break through the cold earth promising beautiful flowers. Warm spring sun promising long days filled with summer warmth.

As I write this & think about the promises of spring, we are heading into Easter and I am currently reading through the book of Joshua. Joshua is full of stories demonstrating the fulfillment of a promise that God gave to faithful men many years before. As the Israelites crossed the Jordan to conquer the land of Canaan, most of their actions resulted in the fulfillment of that promise - to live in the land flowing with milk and honey. God came through on his promise to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Easter reminds us of the fulfillment of another of God's promises. Not only does God promise Abraham that his descendants will possess Canaan, he also promises that "all people on earth will be blessed through [him]" (Genesis 12:3). He gives this promise several times to Abraham throughout his lifetime (Genesis 18:18 & 22:18), and mentions the same promise to Jacob as well (Genesis 28:14). While the promise of the Israelites possessing Canaan came to fruition in a 'short' half millennium, the promise of blessing all the people on earth took a little longer.

Jesus is the follow through on that promise given to Abraham thousands of years ago. Jesus' death and resurrection conquered sin, blessing all the people on earth. Galatians 3 tells us that "those who have faith are blessed along with Abraham" (v. 9) and "there is neither Jew nor Gentile, slave nor free, male nor female, for [we] are all one in Christ Jesus" (v. 28).

A couple thousand years after that first Easter, we continue to wait on the promise of God. We eagerly await the return of Jesus for in John 14, he said "I am going to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." The Bible is full of God's promises fulfilled. There is nothing to suggest that the long awaited Messiah won't some day return, just as He said!

So as we look around at the messiness of spring, remember that it is the sign of a promise fulfilled – winter is over and new life is coming. And that sometimes a promise is worth the wait. Jesus sure is!






At our monthly meetings, we continue to focus on






































# INTRODUCING THE Lacasse family
