#### Junior Kindergarten- Mrs. Baarda

#### Grade 1 - Mrs. Dykstra

It was good to spend a bit of time this week assessing individual student reading skills. Keep reading at home throughout the summer. Reading out loud to your child is essential; having them practice reading each sound in words in books is the next building block. If you would like any direction on finding reading materials appropriate for your child's skill level to keep them reading over the summer, let me know.

Field trip: For tomorrow's field trip (June 6), we will leave the school around 9am and be back at the school by 12:30pm. Students will be taking their backpacks with lunch kits and water bottles on the bus so we can enjoy lunch at the park after the firehall. I have Mrs. Schnikel, Mrs. Rastorfer, and Mrs. Wilting joining us tomorrow. Thank you, volunteer, for taking the time to join us.

**Daily devotions**: We began our last book in the Secrets of the Hidden Scroll series: The Lion's Roar.

In **Bible**, we continue to work on memorizing Psalm 18: 1-2, with daily practice. This week we will focus on the stories of Naomi and Ruth.

Reading/Writing: We will begin working on a bit of poetry in our final weeks of Grade One. Our handwriting book is one place we will practice that. We will listen to many poems. We will try to write a few different styles of poems. We will bring our writing offices home at the end of the year to use through the summer months. Writing a little bit over the summer keeps students on track for beginning Grade Two. We are writers!

Spelling: We made a change to Wednesday June 7 for our show what you know: how, now, brown, cow, clown, down, plow, out, count, snout, south, sound. Then our next and final list will be due on Wednesday June 14. We will practice compound words (using graphemes and syllable rules we have practiced all year): footrest, sunfish, suntan, pigpen, dishpan, himself, sandbox, bathtub, pickup, hotdog, sunset, teapot.

**Math:** We are focusing on time this week. Hopefully we will have some analog clock readers by the end of the week!

Creation Studies: It is mammal week in Grade One! We will create our final two animal crafts this week. The unit test is approaching; we will show what we know on Friday. Our review will be an animal detective game on Thursday. Our final unit in Science is focused on the needs of plants in God's garden.

Chapter book read aloud: Students were delighted by the Arnold Lobel series, Frog and Toad. We begin our eagerly anticipated final book in the Heartwood Hotel series: Home Again. We are on track to break a count of 35 chapter books **PE**: We work on our soccer activities. We begin with soccer ball tabata (to get some fitness in) and single cone soccer.

#### Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

Math: This week we are working on a money unit.

We will be writing our last phonics skill test on this specific phonic skill next week Monday.

#### Grades 4/5 French:

We are continuing our unit on the [very basic] parts of the human body (Les Parties du Corps). As students work through some activity sheets, they have been tracing out their body outline on to large paper. The body outlines will be re-traced, outlined in black, coloured, dressed in shorts and a T-shirt, face and hair details applied, and finally, main body parts labelled. This work should take us, minimally, this week.

#### Grade 5/6 French:

We will be starting our final unit for this year on Sports with use of the verbs FAIRE (to do) and JOUER (to play).

#### Grade 5/6- Mr. Siebenga

In math, the test from last week will go home this week. Grade 5 is carrying on with decimals, and Grade 6 patterns and algebra. Relating to the report cards, these next unit tests, scheduled for June 15, 2023, will be the last for both grades. Each grade has 4 units remaining in their workbook. If you are looking for some extra practice during some drives this summer, or just some casual mathematical downtime, there are some great activities in there!

The students have been given their instructions for finishing up the novel. They will **choose** to write a test or complete a book report. They have review questions to work through to assist in their reflection of the characters, setting, and themes of light, and heroism. The review questions and book report options along with the rubrics are in the G. classroom. The movie comparison will be **NEXT** week.

Our media endeavour has come to a precipice. I hope to salvage the campaign on my return to the classroom. We will film the rants at that time. For most groups this is the last component to their campaign templates.

Our plant procedural experiment has concluded. There are a number of students that did not hand in their final copy of this writing. We continue to work to ensure that all students are completing, engaged, and understanding their academic requirements, depending on their neurodevelopmental abilities.

In Physical, Social, and Emotional Education (PSPE) we will continue looking in depth at our human development and sexual health throughout the next few weeks. We will wrap up Baseball with the tournaments on Thursday, and finish the year off with Frolf!

For spelling, their sorts are up on the G. Classroom.

In art the students will continue to work on their poster for the Listowel Agricultural Fair, linked to the fair's theme-"Feeding the World From Our Own Backyard."

#### Grade 7/8 Science- Ms. VanKampen

We have a few Tuesday double-block classes ahead of us that will allow us to "finish off" our final unit along with completion of a written test on **Pure Substances and Mixtures**.

#### Unit Test: Tuesday, June 13th

To prepare, students are encouraged to re-read and review all text pages and practice answering the short-response and T/F questions that we have done. Lab work is also 'fair game' with respect to one's ability to explain or predict similar results when presented with an experimental scenario.

#### Grade 7/8- Mrs. Vogel

First, I have to apologize for the lack of communication last week. I forgot to send the weekly messenger information on Monday for you to see what was happening.

We are winding down in grade 7/8 and yet not at all! We are busy and will remain so through the next 3 weeks! As the weather pulls students outside, encourage them to finish strong, do their best and study outside if possible.
