

We are continuing to learn about the season of fall. This week we will be learning about, and tasting, some different apples. We will also do some apple stamp painting this week!

In language, we will continue to practice rhyming and we will be filling in rhyming words to familiar songs. We will be blending small words into new words and will begin to segment big words into smaller words. Our mystery letter last week was Aa! We learned about the sound letter a makes and some words, and names, that begin with letter A. What will our mystery letter be this week?

In Bible, we will read about Isaac's birth and learn about Jacob and Esau.

In **math**, we will be counting ourselves to find out which number we count most often. We will also practice counting up to 5.

Thursday we will have reading buddies.

Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida

This week we will learn the sound of the letter Pp and continue to build words using the "at" ending. We will identify the numbers of words per sentence as well as segment and blend compound words together. We will complete our high frequency word "and" project.

In math, we are looking at the concept of greater than and less than by matching objects and by counting the number of objects.

In **Bible**, we will hear about the story of Babel. We continue to learn our memory verse.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will focus on letters L and U.

We will be learning about pumpkins this week.

The weather is feeling colder and the Grade One class has been noticing things outside that are starting to change from our warm summer days to our colder autumn ones now. In all things God is good.

Bible: This week, we will continue on with our story of Abraham and Isaac, while talking about trusting God.

Math: We are working with the words more and less, before and after. We are also practicing counting on from 5. We are practicing holding up five fingers and adding a few more fingers from the other hand to count on from 5.

Language: This week, we will be doing a review on the short a, i, and o vowels that we have been working on the past couple weeks. Our decodable story is coming home for your child to practice with you. Please use this as a review from the previous week as a daily evening homework.

Printing: This week, we continue our Handwriting Without Tears with review of all our magic c letters and then continuing on with letters that don't use magic c. The next letter will be u.

Creation studies: This week, using our school, playground, and classroom as inspiration, we will work as a group to create our ending project for our map unit!

Show and Tell Friday October 20: Hailey, Charity, Emily, Ruby. *This month our theme is to bring in something you are thankful for or something that an explorer might use!*

Grade 2- Mrs. Kuipers

Math - 2D shapes. Students have started a collaborative project with their reading buddies creating dream homes out of shapes. At home, keep practicing identifying shapes in everyday life.

Science - God's Creatures Large & Small! Students are continuing to work on their in class inquiry projects on a reptile of their choice. At home, you can ask them what they have learned about their animals. Encourage discussion about the differences between reptiles, amphibians, and fish such as where they live, if they are cold or warm blooded, do they have live babies or eggs, and what their diets consistent of!

Health - We are learning about healthy food choices and creating healthy eating habits as a way to care for our bodies that God has created.

French- This month, we are focusing on French colours.

Grade 2- Mrs. Grundlingh

Math - Number sense: We are finishing word problems and moving onto ordinal numbers this week.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week, we are reviewing more digraphs as well as reviewing long vowel sounds in words with silent E. Please see the homework practice sheet and decodable text going home this week to help the students practice these phonic skills (they will go home on Thursday/Friday every week).

Creation studies - Social science: This month, we will finish our unit on "Mapping my neighbourhood". This week, our focus is on our planet, the globe, maps and using a compass rose.

Bible: We are still focusing on the Old Testament this week. We are looking at God's special people.

Library: We have library tomorrow. They are allowed to borrow 2 library books at a time. If they return their books tomorrow, they can either renew it or get 2 new books. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

Grade 3- Mrs. Claus

Last week was a short week but an interesting week. I am thankful that God created the week in the way He has. We are able to start fresh every Monday morning.

Bible: This week, we will be looking at the maps at the back of the Bible and finishing off our unit.

Math: Our patterning unit is almost complete. We have worked a lot with number patterns. The last few lessons will be about attributes, repeating patterns and finding the core of a pattern, and writing a rule for it.

Language: The MAP tests revealed a lot of what we already suspected. Half of the class is struggling to read and understand language while the other half is above grade level. This is challenging for our class. My goal is to meet the students where they are at. With the help of our language program, we will do our best to help each student progress. Last week, we opened our phonics books. The students all did very well with applying their knowledge to the activities.

Creation Studies: We are wrapping up our unit on trees. This week, we will review what we've learned so far and our test will be on Thursday.

Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

Bible - We will continue our unit, "The Setting of God". In this unit we will introduce key places and events in Bible history, analyze the organization of the books of the Bible, and discuss biblical languages. We will also study maps and timelines, and will learn about the setting and chronological order of salvation history.

Our memory work is: The Books of the Bible and will be due on Nov. 3rd.

Language - We will conclude our work with nouns and will begin to look at adjectives. We will look at including details that support the main idea in our written work. We will continue to look at text features and visual information to help us with our reading comprehension. Our words of the week are: taunt, jester, and obsolete and exaggerate.

Social Studies - We will continue our unit - "Why is there French on my cereal box?" We will look at what does it mean to be created in the image of God, what can I begin to learn about the culture of New France and of my classroom and explore faith/religion as a determining aspect of culture.

Science - We will continue our unit - "Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" where we will be looking at human organ systems. This week we will look at what physical fitness is and how we know if we are fit and what we can do to be fit. We will also look at how food and oxygen move to cells and how carbon dioxide and waste leave the body. Finally we will look at cellular metabolism and how materials move in and out of a cell.

Art - We will look at shape and form and will work on taking a 2-D image and making it 3-D.

Health - We will conclude our anti-bullying unit and will begin to look at Healthy Eating

Carrying over from last week, students will be undertaking some [in-class] independent research on Canadian water issues by way of online articles and videos. Ideally, this assignment is to be completed by end-of-class Wednesday.

Grade 7/8 Math- Mr. Boelens

Math: We continue to work through our unit on ratios. This week we will look at applications of ratios for both classes. The Grade 8s will also look at consumer math (discounts, sales tax, commission, and interest). Daily homework is regularly assigned. Students should also have brought home their unit 1 work for you to sign. If you haven't seen it yet, ask them for it.

History: We are working on a mid-unit project on New France. Students had a goal to be done their research by today so they can use today's class period to work on their presentations. They should be ready with their class handout to me so I can photocopy it for the class on Wednesday, October 18, and their presentation on Thursday, October 19.

Healthy Living: We are also nearing the end of our Health unit on Digital Citizenship. Students finished Rule posters showing how to behave in different tech and online spaces and will have a final test this week either on Wednesday, October 18, or Friday, October 20.

We also started a new unit in **Phys. Ed**. looking at volleyball and working to control the ball and work as a team, not individuals.

Music: All students now have a book to be practicing out of. We worked on the first few songs last week and will continue working through pages 6 and 7 this week together. It is really starting to sound good!

French: We have a French quiz on Tuesday, October 17 on faire, aller, -ir verbs, and -re verbs.
