The last of the beautiful leaves fall and we enter into a chillier, darker time of year. Our fields and yards turn frosty, and quickly stark white with snow. The sun hides its radiant face from us, and some of us struggle to find the happiness and motivation for life that we usually have in the warmer months.

I'd like us to take a moment to recognize the people who drudge through the darkness, winter after winter. Seasonal depression is hard, especially in Canada. Those going through a difficult, draining season of life... I see you too. Life can really get to us sometimes! I want you to know that you're not alone. Many struggle, even in the Bible. The prophet Jeremiah said," I am weary with my groaning and have found no rest." (Jeremiah 45:3 NIV)

Thankfully, for those struggling, our world is taking a turn towards being more accepting and nurturing towards those who suffer with mental health issues. But what about the church and our Christian community? One would hope that it would be trending the same way, however some of us may have felt the sting of being cast aside or ashamed of their struggles. Often, the Church sees depression and anxiety as a lack of faith. I say this, not to be negative, but to invite you to open your mind and heart to see those around you in a new light.

If you are grappling with the claws of depression and mental health issues, you are not alone. Taking a look into God's Word and we see that Moses, who was a powerful leader and had seen many miracles, also got to a point of despair. "I cannot carry all these people by myself, the burden is too heavy for me. If this is how you are going to treat me, put me to death right now - if I have found no favor in your eyes - and do not let me face my own ruin." (Numbers 11:14-15 NIV) Moses certainly had the choice to pull away and be alone, but he instead surrounded himself with people who could help carry the burden! This is what God intended in

his design of community. Being isolated is the worst thing for a person dealing with depression, anxiety or other mental health struggles. The devil wants you to be alone in your pain and despair, so that his voice is the only one you can hear.

If your thought is to withdraw to be with just Jesus, my response would be to consider this. Being alone with God is amazing, but He is always nudging us towards community with people for many reasons. For wisdom, guidance, and counsel from those who can help us. "Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety." (Proverbs 11:14 ESV) Remaining surrounded by people who care for you is key for God's love being fully known. A community of people with God in their hearts, and your best interest as their intention is something to be thankful for. We need each other! "That there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together. Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it" (1 Corinthians 12:25-27)

What about the stigma attached to other forms of help - therapy and medication. What does the Bible say about these forms of help?

For medication... who do you think inspired the chemist's to create a solution to this problem? Jesus did. He created a miracle through chemistry. When you pray to God for help and He sends it in the form of a doctor and medication, who are you to negotiate how the help appears? Medicine is **one** of the ways God can help our pain physical, emotional or mental.

There is no shame in receiving the help needed to be the happy, healthy and life driven person God intended you to be!

TEACHING WITH PURPOSE

Once we get snow on the ground, the days of September seem like a long time ago. Just three months ago we were introducing ourselves to our new class, setting schedules and routines, and investing in our classroom culture. Along with planning our daily lessons, we were also looking at our year long plans. Setting the stage for a good year is worth the time spent in September.

Ideally, everything we do at LCS fits within our purpose statement. First of all, we are educating children. Since September, many of us have completed our first, and maybe our

second, units in most subject areas. We challenged students to participate in assignments, activities, and various sorts of assessments. They worked individually, in small groups, and in large group settings. We taught them math and language, science and art, Bible and French, along with gym and our curriculum on health and heathy lifestyles – treating our peers with respect. The academic term

culminated with parent teacher conferences and then report cards. Working in partnership with our parents, we strive to educate the whole child to the best of our ability.

Secondly, but not less important, we strive to nurture their faith in Christ. We open and close our day with devotions and reflections on Christian living. We host assemblies related to our theme on the Beatitudes – understanding that

we are very blessed and therefore called to be a blessing to others. We are learning that the beatitudes call us to be very different than the world expects us to be. We also integrate our faith into our daily interactions and curriculum.




















INTRODUCING Heather Denhartog GRADE 1
