## Junior Kindergarten- Mrs. Baarda:

Happy New Year and welcome back!

For the month of January the JK class will be exploring a winter theme. This week we will be decorating mitten pictures, and making a snowstorm in a jar!

In **language** we will continue to practice rhyming, as well as isolating and blending sounds. We will have a new Mystery Letter this week as well.

In our Handwriting Without Tears workbook we will be tracing the letters H, T and I.

We will also begin to build and trace our names each morning.

In **Bible** we will be shifting back into the Old Testament and will learn about Jonah. We have a new memory verse and song this month. Our verse is Hebrews 13:5b-6a: "God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." So we say "The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid". Our new song is "My God is so Big".

In **Math** we will review patterns this week before moving on to new lessons on size next week. Our new focus shape this month is the oval, our new focus colour is blue, and our focus number is 5.

Tuesday is Library day, please return any books you still have at home so students can take home their new choices.

This month I will begin to do some assessments in preparation for report cards that will be coming home in the near future.

### Senior Kindergarten- Mrs. Heida:

Happy New Year!! Welcome to 2024!! Some students may be a little disappointed that they are still in SK because some students thought they were going to Grade 1 after Christmas break. Whatever they think, I look forward to welcoming them back to SK. I hope everyone had a wonderful break!

This week we will be learning the hard sound of the letter Cc in words such as castle, cat, cake, caterpillar. We will blend and segment words as well as review the words the, I, and, a, is, as..

In **Handwriting Without Tears** we will continue to learn lowercase letters. This week we will focus on the letter v and w which go between the lines.

In math, we will review what a pattern is and begin with making an action pattern such as up and down up and down. We would identify the pattern as an AB pattern because every action up would be A and every down action will be B. We are counting to 40 and working on printing numbers to 20.

In **Bible**, we will learn about Joseph and how he interacted with his brothers and how his brothers treated him. Our memory verse is Romans 8:28 - And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose.

On Fridays throughout January we will go skating. This Friday afternoon I will be away. I am asking for some parents to come and help tie skates and help children on the ice with the skate assists. Please send skates, helmets and gloves to school in a separate bag for skating. Label everything with their name. We arrive at the arena around 1:40pm and get off the ice at 2:35pm.

#### Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:

Happy New Year! I hope your family was able to enjoy the time off celebrating the birth of Jesus and the brand-new year we have been given.

**Bible:** Our Memory work for the month of January is Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future."

Please practice this verse at home!

In our Bible unit we will be looking at King David and why he was so special to God.

Language: We will be starting our new unit of comparing texts. In our UFLI lessons we will be working with the voiced th sound.

Math: In math we are starting our new unit of Number Sense: counting to 100.

French: Our unit for the month of January will be learning about the family.

**Gym and Health:** In Gym this month we will be working on Receiving objects by catching and stopping objects that are moving. In health we will learn about our amazing body!

Show and Tell Friday January 12: Boston, Melanie, Caleb, Hailey, Emily, Ruby \* This month's theme is either something that reminds you of something new or an object that reminds you of winter.

On Fridays Mrs. Kuipers will be assessing the two new phonics skills and heart words that they have learned and practiced in class and at home for that particular week.

Creation studies - Social science: We continue our unit on our local community and this week we focus on "All are different, all are precious". Please remember to work on the assignments. The date they need to be returned is on January 16th. Bible: We start a new unit on "Jesus's ministries"

**Library:** We have library tomorrow. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.

# Grade 2- Mrs. Kuipers:

Welcome back! I am so excited to start off our 2024 year together. As we get back into the routine of things and look ahead to a new year, we also look back at the incredible blessings that 2023 brought.

#### Notable Information for the week

**Friday Skating-** We have skating at the end of the day, so please send a small snack that can be quickly grabbed from our packed bags and eaten as we walk to the bus to go home. Remember skates, gloves, and helmets.

Science- We will be wrapping up our current unit and will have a test next week. Look for a review that will come home at the end of this week.

We will be leaving the school after we take attendance. We ask that students DO NOT bring a backpack along, only lunch pails. ### Grade 5/6- Mrs. O'Boyle

Bible - We will review our unit on "Later Judean Ministry" and wrap up our learning on this topic.

Language - We will continue to look at articles and pronouns in grammar. In writing we will work on elaborating our ideas and details. We will continue to look at cause and effect and then will move on to comparing and contrasting in reading. We will be working on fluency and expression with choral reading of five minute mysteries this week, where we will also work on our deductive reasoning and inferencing skills. Our words of the week are: fastidious, lunge, array and promotion.

**Spelling** - Watch for nightly spelling practice methods coming home in your child's agenda. We will have our next spelling test on Jan. 19th.

**Social Studies** - We will look at the seigneurial system and the daily life of New France. We will focus on how strong relationships are crucial to the health of any culture.
