## Junion Kindergarten-Mrs. Baarda

Due to a snow day last week and finishing up assessments for report cards, we did not get through some of our lessons for last week. We will try again this week to complete them.

Our mystery letter last week was the letter Gg. We sang the Jolly Phonics song for letter $G$ and found the upper and lowercase forms of letter G on a letter find page.
We met Magic C Bunny, and he helped us learn how to print the letter C. We will learn some more letters that begin by making a Magic C this week: letters O and Q .

This week, we begin a new Bible unit about Jesus. Our first lessons will be about Jesus and the children and how Jesus heals a blind man.

In math, we will have a lesson on indirect comparisons of length, and we will begin to explore capacity.

In Health, we will be talking about things that families do together.

Report cards for JK will be coming home on Tuesday. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns regarding the reports. I would be happy to discuss them with you.

## Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week, we will finish up our lesson on letter Gg and have a look at letter Bb. We will look at a new paragraph to read that includes the new high frequency words "to" and "do".

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will print lowercase letter "t" and print words using lowercase letters that either go between the line, below the line, or above the line.

In math, we will begin a new unit comparing numbers between 6 and 10. We will be using math words such as equal, greater than, and less than. We are counting to 50 and learning what number comes "before" a number between 1-10.

In Bible, we will wrap up our unit on Joseph as he is reunited with his brothers. On Friday, we will begin a new unit about Moses.

Our new memory work is Exodus 15:2. It is on the February calendar.

This week we will learn about polar bears and make a polar bear craft.

The February calendar has been sent home. I want to thank all the parents who helped tie and untie skates during our January skating times. Your help was greatly appreciated! All the students made great progress in their own way. I am very proud of their effort. Have a fantastic week!

## Grade 2

## Grade 2-Mrs. Grundlingh:

Math - Number sense: This week, we continue our unit on addition and subtraction.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week, we are still focusing on the long vowel teams ie, igh and $i$ as well and doing some vowel team review. Please see the homework practice sheet going home today to help the students practice these phonic skills. On Fridays, Mrs. Kuipers will be assessing the two new phonics skills and heart words that they have learned and practiced in class and at home for that particular week. We will also be doing Dibels assessments this week.

Creation studies - Social science: This week, we are listening to the last few presentations of our student's cultural scrapbooks. Due to the snow day last week we didn't start our new unit on Tuesday. We will start our new unit on communities around the world this week.

Bible: We continue the unit on "Jesus's ministries".

## Grade 5/6 Math - Ms. Van Kampen:

Grade 6 will continue the unit on Number Sense, focusing on standard [vertical] multiplication (2 digit by 2 digit, 3 digit by 2 digit) and long division with the plan for a unit test to occur on Friday afternoon.

Grade 5 will be provided with a variety of math [number sense] activities as the Grade 6 students complete their current unit. The plan is to begin a unit on measurement with both grades next week.

Homework: Students will be expected to complete work assigned in class for the following class period.

Students yet struggling with the Times Tables (i.e. 1 through 12) would benefit from and are strongly encouraged to practice these facts at home, committing them to memory, as they are foundational to our current unit and beyond.

## Grade 5/6 French - Madame Van Kampen:

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## Grade 5/6-Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will begin a new unit on the Triumphal Entry through Passover.

Memory Work - "For I received from the Lord what I also passed on to you: The Lord Jesus, on the night he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you; do this in remembrance of me." 25 In the same way, after supper he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood; do this, whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." For whenever you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. 1 Corinthians 11:23-26" Due: Wed. Feb. 14th

Language - We will continue to look at articles and pronouns in grammar. In writing, we will work on elaborating our ideas and including details. We will also work on writing topic sentences and proper paragraphs. We will specifically work on writing pieces related to our Wonder novel study. We will practice our reading comprehension through our Wonder novel study. We will continue to work on fluency and expression with choral, echo, and partner reads of five minute mysteries this week, where we will also work on our deductive reasoning and inferencing skills. Our words of the week will also be tied to our novel study Wonder, where we closely examine unknown or less common words, such as, anomaly, elective, ordinary, cleft palate, hysterical, hindsight, obnoxious, schlep, precept, stampede, and mortality.

Spelling - Next test will be on Feb. 9th.
Social Studies - We will look at the fur trade in New France, and will also look at language and what led to bilingualism.

Science - Our Lifestyles Down the Generations interview is due Tues. Jan. 30th.
We will review healthy eating and the importance of physical activity this week. We will also explore blood, covering topics such as what blood is and blood transfusions.

Art - We will continue to look at texture and create our own Eric Carle animal collage pictures. (Hoping for no more Wednesday snow days so we can have some uninterrupted studio time!)

Health - We will continue our unit on Mental Health and will be looking specifically at the stigma that is often attached to mental health.
