## From the Principals Desk

## And the planning begins!

First of all, thanks to all the families who completed their re-enrolment forms. This week we will follow up on the last few remaining forms so we can accurately predict what next year might look like for class structures and staffing. Our larger class sizes are creeping into the upper classes causing some potential changes there as well.

Just recently, the Board approved a recommendation to increase our JK program from two days a week to three days a week. This is a result of a survey completed last year and a public move toward increased Kindergarten classroom time. Three days a week seems to be a good compromise for our LCS community.

We are also receiving increased interest in Junior Kindergarten for next year. This may be a historic year for LCS - we might offer two JK classes! Our goal will be to solidify our JK numbers in the next two weeks. If you received an invitation to fill out the kindergarten survey but haven't yet, please do so soon. Your input will help us make important decisions.

Lastly, we are also considering offering additional days for kindergarten students to fill the need for daycare. This will be offered as needed and feasible for LCS. The final decision will be made once we have more forms submitted.

This is exciting, our school is growing. We are sharing our gift of Christian education with more and more families. As a result, you will see some job opportunities listed below. Please consider people you might know who could fill these positions and encourage them to apply.

## Junion Kindergarten-Mrs. Baarda

February has flown by! We are nearing the end of our Love and Family theme and next week we will begin a theme all about Nursery Rhymes.

Our mystery letter last week was letter Bb. We learned that butterfly, bell, ball and bed all begin with the sound letter B makes.

In our Handwriting Without Tears workbook, we will learn more about diagonal lines, and we will be printing letters $K$ and $A$ this week.

In math, we will begin a new unit and we will take a closer look at numbers and see that they are all around us!

In Bible, we will learn that Jesus helps people who do wrong. We will also begin a new unit about the Parables of Jesus and read about Jesus being the Good Shepherd.

In Health, we will be wrapping up our unit on families and will begin a new unit about the five senses.

## Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on VC (Vowel Consonant) and CVC (Consonant, Vowel, Consonant) words using the letters that we have learned with a special focus on the short vowel sounds. We will be learning The Vowel Song to help us to remember which letters are vowels. We just received enough cookie sheets with the magnetic alphabet letters so that everyone may participate during our word work.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will focus on the lowercase letter Uu and printing on a line or between the lines or above the lines while using a proper pencil grip.

In math, we will compare the length and width of objects. We will be measuring weight by using a pan balance to determine the heaviness or lightness of a variety of objects.

In Bible, we will learn how the Israelites are provided with food and drink in the desert as well as The 10 Commandments.

Our memory verse is Exodus 15:2a The Lord is my strength and my song; and he has become my salvation.

In our Friendship unit, we will review how we can use our toolbox when in conflict with a friend. We have been talking about apologizing, walking away, telling someone to STOP, asking a teacher for help, ignoring what your friend is doing, giving your friend space, offering to help, or asking what is wrong.
Being a good friend means caring and sharing. We will read and make The Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister.

Math - Number sense: This week we work on estimating.
