

From the Principals Desk

Several years ago, the Ontario Alliance of Christian Schools (now called Edvance Christian Schools) wrote Christian curriculum for our schools. They took the Ontario curriculum and integrated Christian perspective. The primary grades have social studies and science units called "The Sky Declares the Glory of God" and "The Seas Declare the Glory of God". Kindergarten

<u> Junion Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

During the month of March we will be learning about and exploring nursery rhymes. This week we will make Itsy Bitsy Spiders!

In **language**, we will have a new mystery letter. Last week's letter was Qq. We practiced making the sound letter Q makes and worked on a letter find page to help us recognize the upper and lowercase forms of the letter.

In our workbooks this week, we will be tracing triangle and diamond shapes as well as the letter M.

In **Math**, we will be learning about ordinal numbers. We have a new focus shape this month, the diamond, and our focus colour is white. Our number for the month is 7.

In **Bible**, we will read two more parables: "The Sower" and "The Wise and Foolish Builders". **Luke 10:27** is our new memory verse "*He answered "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind and love your neighbour as yourself*".

In **Health**, we will begin to explore our five senses by identifying what those five senses are.

Thursday is Pyjama Day in JK! We don't want to miss the fun, so JK students are welcome to come in their pyjamas on Thursday since we are not here on Friday when the rest of the school will dress in their comfy pj's.

<u> Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida</u>

This week we will focus on the suffix "s", added to a singular noun (cat) which makes it a plural noun (cats). We will blend and segment words and copy a sentence remembering where to have spaces and punctuation.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will practice printing letter u and words with the short vowel u on the lines provided.

In **math**, we will complete our measurement unit learning about weight and money. Students will have a hands on experience with a pan balance and with sorting money by the picture on the front. They will hear the coin names of dime, nickel, quarter, loonie and toonie.

In **Bible**, we will learn about The Golden Calf and the Tabernacle. We will be reciting Exodus 15:2a with actions and singing My God Is So Big.

The **March calendar** has been sent home. We will be reading Dr, Suess books so that we can hear lots of rhyming and nonsense words.

On **Friday March 8**, **2024**, we will have pajama day and bring a stuffy to school day. Please wear pjs that are easy to manage in the bathroom and a stuffy that your child can manage. At the end of the day we will gather as school teams to read books. If your child has a favourite storybook they would like someone to read to them please send it along.

<u>Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:</u>

Bible: Our **Memory work** for the month of March will be "Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." John 14:6. A colouring page with this verse will be coming home. Please practice with your child every evening. We will practice in class too. It will be said to me on Friday March 29.

Language: In our UFLI lessons, we will be working with the digraph "ng" (as in nk). In our Handwriting without tears book, we will be practicing printing the letter Zz.

Math: This week we will finish up ordering numbers. Then we change over and look at coins and their values.

Science: We are starting our new unit titled: "The Sky declares". In this unit we will explore concepts of the earth and weather. Students will become "sky watchers" as they explore day and night, the seasons and the conditions of our weather. Students will come to an understanding and appreciation of God as Creator of the heavens and the earth.

Grade 2 - Mrs. Grundlingh:

We have had a busy, but blessed second term in Grade 2. Enjoy your March break!! Here is our work for the last week of this term :

Math - Number sense: This week we continue working on estimating.

Phonics, spelling and reading: We are focusing on the graphemes EA and A as well as the graphemes OI and OY. Please see the homework practice sheet that went home today to help the students practice these phonic skills. Mrs Kuipers will be assessing the two new phonics skills and heart words that they have learned and practiced in class and at home on Friday.

Bible: We start a new unit on Easter.

Library: We have library tomorrow. Please encourage them to develop the habit of bringing their books to school every Tuesday, even if they would just like to renew it.
