

From the Principal's Desk

Today you will receive the report card(s) for your child(ren). The teachers have put a lot of thought and discernment into these reports. I hope you take some time to review and reflect upon them.

As you read through the reports, celebrate the strengths and gifts noted about your child. What are they good at? Where are they excelling? What attributes are they exhibiting that make you proud? Highlight these and make sure your child knows you are noticing the positives in the report card. At the same time, there are always areas of growth. Don't dwell on these as negative: everyone has strengths and challenges. Note them as challenges and talk about why they are difficult. Spend some time with each of your children to discuss the details.

This is also a good time to set some goals for the rest of the year. How will your child finish strong? Are there suggestions from the teachers such as complete homework more often, focus in class, or contribute to discussions? Are there home changes that are possible such as delegate homework time, read more with or to your child, or simply remember to bring things back and forth from home to school. We have three and a half months left of school and there are still lots of lessons to learn. Now is a good time to refocus for a strong finish to the year.

Remember that report cards are meant to communicate learning progress at this time. These are opportunities to make changes and strive to do better. We hope and pray that these reports will be a tool for you to celebrate and nurture growth in your child.

Kindergarten

Welcome back! I hope everyone had an enjoyable March Break and is feeling ready for the last few months of school!

We will contniue to explore nursery rhymes for the remainder of the month of March. This week we will look at Humpty Dumpty and Hickory Dickory Dock.

We will have a new mystery letter this week that we will learn the Jolly Phonics song for as well as practice recognizing the upper and lowercase forms of that letter.

In our **workbooks**, we will be tracing the letter N, and we will be tracing more shapes as well.

Grade 1 - Ms. Denhartog:

Welcome back! I hope everyone had a wonderful March Break and are ready to get back to the routine of school.

Language - In writing, we will work on elaborating our ideas, including details, and extending our writing. We will practice our reading comprehension through our Wonder novel study by using a variety of strategies to answer questions related to the text. We will also look at how an author may use a compare-and-contrast text structure to write an informational text. Our words of the week will also be tied to our novel study Wonder, where we closely examine unknown or less common words, such as, exasperated, babushka, defective, and giddy.

Blind Date with a Book - Book review templates were sent home prior to the break and can also be found on Google classroom - language. Finished book reviews will be due on Mar. 22nd. Students will present their book reviews to the class on this date.
