## Junion Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda

This week we will be planting seeds! We will plant bean and flower seeds to watch them sprout and learn about how they grow.

In language, we will continue to work on rhyming, blending, and listening for initial and final sounds. We will have a new Mystery Letter!

In our Handwriting Without Tears workbook, we will be spending a few days reviewing how to print the uppercase letters.

In Bible, we will read about the appearances of Jesus and about his ascension.

In math, we will be doing some scoop estimating where we take a small handful of items and guess how many there are before counting.

In health, we will be learning about our sense of touch, and adding another page to our Five Senses book.

Tuesday is library day. Please remember to send in books from last week so students can bring home their new choices.

## Senior Kindergarten-Mrs. Heida

This week, we will focus on the sound of the letter Hh, which is an unvoiced sound and is a breath that you can feel on your hand. We will be blending and segmenting words that begin with letter Hh and using magnetic letters to make word chains on our cookie sheets.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will focus on the lowercase letters y and j . These letters hang below the line. We will also be printing a sentence using these letters and a proper sentence structure.

In math, we will begin a new unit of adding numbers up to 10 . We are really focusing on the concept of how many altogether and printing our numbers in the correct orientation.

In Bible, we will begin a new unit about Jesus's Ministry. Our memory work is John 14:6, "Jesus answered, 'I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."' We will be singing Jesus Loves Me https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=tm3MyG2Zht0 and I Have Decided to Follow Jesus https://www.facebook.com/watch/?v=560746875278182.

We will be learning about spring weather. Our first stop will be to learn about the total solar eclipse on Monday. We will focus on what happens during an eclipse and why it only happens every 100 years. Then we will focus on the sun, what it is made of, how to protect ourselves and why we need the sun. Later in the week, we will be learning about clouds and making our own clouds with shaving cream.

This is our work with me for the week:

Math - Number sense: This week we look at more addition strategies.
Phonics, spelling and reading:

## Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will conclude our unit on Jesus' Death. Unit test will be on Tuesday. We will then begin a new unit on Jesus' Resurrection.

Language - In writing, we are working on informal email writing. We will also work on including proper punctuation and adding paragraphs to our writing. In grammar, we are continuing to look at pronouns. To work on our reading comprehension we will look at how an author may use a compare-and-contrast text structure to write an informational text. Our words of the week are: horrific, syndrome, illuminate, sympathetic, potential, retrospect, stringent, protocol, hypocrite and tic. We will also continue our children's literature battle of the books. Watch our class Facebook page for bracket updates.

Social Studies - We will continue our unit - From Far and Wide. We will continue to look at a variety of different aspects of the Canadian provinces including populations, when they joined confederation, where they are located, their size, and their flags. Students are working on group presentations and will teach their peers about each aspect listed above.

## Grade 5/6

Science - We will continue our unit called Space Declares. This week we will be looking at the solar eclipse, how the planets are arranged in our solar system, what the role of the Sun in the solar system is, and the distances between the planets using about 5 metres of wall space to display the solar system. We will also complete a STEM challenge using cookies to display the different phases of the moon.

Art - We will continue working on our 3-D word art. We will be making both a colour and black and white version to compare and contrast how that affects the mood of a piece. We are focusing on F.A.I.L. with this piece, knowing that FAIL stands for the first attempt in learning, and that multiple attempts means we are constantly learning and progressing.

Health - We dive deeper and extend our study on Mental Health. We are looking specifically at emotions and strategies to use when experiencing different emotions. We will also continue to explore the zone of regulation and become familiar with figuring out what zone our emotions fit in at different times throughout the day.
