## Junion Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda

This week, we will continue to explore all things spring. We will look at the seeds we planted and see if they have sprouted. We will also sing a couple of songs about growing plants.

In language, we will be coming up with rhyming words, blending and segmenting words, and listening to hear if two words begin with the same sound. We will also be listening for the final sound in a word. We have been practicing saying the name of a letter and its sound when we see a picture of the letter.

In our Handwriting Without Tears workbook, we will continue to review printing the uppercase letters.

In math, we will continue to practice printing the numbers 110, this time in our Handwriting Without Tears workbook.

In Bible, we return to our unit on the Parables of Jesus. This week we will hear about the widow's offering and the rich young man.

Twin Day Tuesday is a spirit day where students can dress up as a twin with a classmate or friend. This can be as simple as dressing in the same colour, or as complicated as you want!

## Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week, we will focus on the sound of the letter Rr when it is at the beginning of a word like red, rib, rim etc. We will continue to rhyme, blend and segment words. This week, we will also have show and tell, since it is spring and all things are new again. Please bring in something that is new for you.

In math, we are adding numbers to 10 using a number line. It is good to discourage the students from using their fingers as eventually they will run out of fingers so this week we will use a number line to get the idea of counting on.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will be learning about diver letters that swim back up and complete the letter. This week is letter Pp and printing words and sentences.

In Bible, we will learn about Jesus blessing the children and Jesus's teaching on prayer. Our memory work is John $\mathbf{1 4 : 6}$ and we are singing I Have Decided to Follow Jesus and Jesus Loves Me.

In science, we are learning about clouds, raindrops, and rainbows. On Monday, every student needs a jar for the raindrop experiment. I have a few extras, but if you could send one with your child that would be great.

On Tuesday, we will create a rainbow for art and look at the prism in our classroom.

On Thursday, we will learn about windy weather and what things get blown by the wind.

On Friday, we will be wrapping up our weather unit.

On Tuesday we will have a Spirit Day of dressing as twins. You can call someone and match outfits by colour, you can make siblings match, if students want to match me I am wearing a LCS shirt and black jeans. Keep it simple, do not buy anything new, use what you already have. It is a Spirit Day.

## Grade 1

## Grade 1-Ms. Denhartog:

Bible: Our Memory work for the month of April is Genesis 1: 24. Science: This week in our Sky Declares unit, we will be talking about rain, snow, and wind. God created weather patterns and cycles in a perfect design, and He continues to take care of his world.

Math - Number sense: This week, we look at different ways to write numbers and we look at regrouping.

## Phonics, spelling and reading:

This week we focus on the following:

- Suffixes: -less, -ful
- Prefix: un-

Please see the homework practice sheet that went home in their envelopes or via email today to help the students practice these phonic skills as well as the specific spelling words in Mrs Kuipers' message. Spelling test will be on Friday April 19th.

Creation studies - Social science: We continue our unit on Canada and spend time this week focusing on The Arms of Canada, the Monarchy, and Victoria day.

Bible: This week, we are looking at two mighty miracles that led the disciples to begin to recognize Jesus as the Son of God and Peter's confession that Jesus was the Christ, the Messiah promised by the prophets.
Our Bible verse for the next 3 weeks is Matthew 16:24-25
Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it.

Library: We have library tomorrow. Please bring your library books to school, even if you would just like to renew it.

Twin day: Tomorrow is twin day. If you are unsure what that is all about ... please send me a message.

## Grade 2 -Mrs. Kuipers:

Social Studies - We will continue our unit - From Far and Wide. This week, we will look at the population density and settlement patterns in Canada, as well as Canada's climate.
Science - We will continue our unit called Space Declares. This week we will complete various STEM challenges relating to the solar system. We will complete a STEM challenge using cookies to display the different phases of the moon, a manual coding activity where students will create a code for each of the planets, as well as a crater formation investigation using a variety of objects and flour.
Art - We will continue working on our 3-D word art. We will be making both a colour and black and white version to compare and contrast how that affects the mood of a piece.
